



After Years of Strong Growth, Per Capita Food Availability is Declining in SSA driven by multiple factors impacting both food and nutrition supply and demand



Population growth & urbanization present economic opportunities but also raise pressure on production to deliver sufficient food with lower per capita endowments of natural resources



Fragility & conflict disrupt food production & livelihoods in lasting ways. Vice-versa, food insecurity contributes to migration and competition over natural resources.

SUPPLY SIDE PRESSURE


The frequency of severe droughts and floods has increased from once every 12.5 years (1982-2006) to once every 2.5 years (2007-2016)




Climate Change exerts increasing pressure on the supply side of food production through adverse trends in average temperatures, precipitation and the frequency as well as intensity of extreme events.

As of 2019, 234 million sub-Saharan Africans were chronically undernourished, more than in any other region. In the whole of Africa, 250 million people were experiencing hunger, which is nearly 20% of the population.






