### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa as of September 6, 2020<sup>2</sup>


- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases reached 27,003,973 as of September 6, 2020, the majority of which (52.2%) were in the Americas, followed by Asia (28.5%) and Europe (14.3%). The number of new cases reported globally in the review week, amounted to 1,782,038. To date, 18,072,897 cases have recovered, representing 66.9% of confirmed Covid-19 cases. The number of global deaths reached 882,062 of which 35,677 were recorded in the past week. The number of global active cases stands at 8,049,014.
- Africa accounted for 4.8% of the total global cases, 3.5% of deaths, 5.7% of recovered cases and 2.9% of active cases, as of September 6, 2020. The number of active cases in Africa and its global share began to fall since the last month, as a result of higher recoveries compared to newly recorded cases.
- As of Sunday September 6, 2020, more than 12.5 million people had been tested for Covid-19 in Africa, of which over 0.7 million were conducted in the week under review. The majority (30.3%) of these tests were conducted in South Africa followed by Morocco (16.5%), Ethiopia (8.3%), Egypt (3.7%), Kenya (3.8%) and Ghana (3.6%), which collectively accounted for 66.2% of the tests conducted in Africa.
- Considering tests in relation to population size, Mauritius leads with 178,813 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (137,730), Djibouti (70,248), South Africa (64,075), Morocco (56,083), Gabon (54,952), and Botswana (54,437). The average tests per 1 million people in Africa, stands at 9,373, which is an increase of 6.3% over the past week.
- Tests per case in Africa stand at 9.7 as of September 6, 2020, indicating that there is one confirmed case for every 10 tests conducted, compared to 20.0 for the world. Regionally, the values for tests per case were 19.8 for East Africa, 12.2 for North Africa, 10.2 for Central Africa, 10.1 for West Africa and 6.8 for Southern Africa.
- As of September 6, 2020, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 1,299,549. The majority of these cases (54.2%) were reported in Southern Africa, followed by North Africa at 19.1%, West Africa at 12.7% and East Africa at 9.9%. Central Africa is the least affected region representing 4.1% of the total cases in Africa. Southern Africa was the region with the highest number of cases, with 90.7% of those cases reported in the nation of South Africa; the remaining countries of the region are among the least affected.
- South Africa, Egypt, Morocco, Ethiopia, Nigeria, Algeria, Ghana and Kenya together account for 80.8% of the cases in Africa, as of September 6, 2020. Five countries with the least number of cases are the Seychelles, Eritrea, Mauritius, Comoros and Burundi, which collectively account for less than 0.2% of the cases in Africa. Considering population size, South Africa, Cabo Verde, Djibouti, Eswatini and São Tomé and Príncipe are the five countries with

the highest number of confirmed cases per million people. Rates in these countries range from 10,904 in South Africa to 4,177 in São Tomé and Príncipe.

- In the week under review, a total of 54,119 new cases were reported in Africa, which is 5.8% lower compared to the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 3.0% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The North Africa region accounted for 37.2% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by Southern Africa (33.5%), East Africa (18.6%), West Africa (8.0%), and Central Africa (2.7%).
- As of September 6, 2020, a total of 31,300 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 51.6% were in Southern Africa, 28.7% in North Africa, 8.4% in East Africa, 7.9% in West Africa and 3.4% in Central Africa. South Africa, Egypt, Algeria, Morocco and Nigeria are the five countries with the highest reported deaths due to Covid-19. A total of 1,714 new deaths were reported in the week under review, which is a decline of 4.8% compared to the preceding week. As of September 6, 2020, Eritrea and the Seychelles are the only countries in Africa not to have reported any deaths since the onset of the pandemic.
- The case fatality rate (CFR) for Africa stands at 2.4% in the review period, which is lower than the global average of 3.3%. However, CFR in Africa showed an increase compared its level of 2.1% in July 2020, mainly reflecting the trend in the Southern Africa region, while the global average CFR is on a continuous decline. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.5%, followed by Central Africa at 2.0%, East Africa at 2.1% and Southern Africa at 2.3%, while North Africa at 3.6% recorded higher CFR than the African average. Higher than the global average CFRs have been recorded in ten African countries, namely Chad (7.6%), Liberia (6.3%), Sudan (6.2%), Niger (5.9%), Egypt (5.5%), Mali (4.5%), Angola (3.9%), Burkina Faso (3.8%), Sierra Leone (3.5%), and Algeria (3.4%)
- As of September 6, 2020, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 1,036,163, which is 79.7% of its total confirmed cases. The recovery rate is higher than the African average in Southern Africa (86.9%), West Africa (84.7%) and Central Africa (82.2%), while North Africa (71.1%) and East Africa (49.6%) showed relatively lower recovery rates. In the week under review, 60,019 newly recovered cases were reported.
- As of September 6, 2020, the total number of active cases in Africa stands at 232,086, which is a reduction of 7,614 cases over the previous week. Africa saw a reduction in active cases in the past four consecutive weeks, as the numbers of recovered cases were higher than the number of newly recorded cases within the period. In the week under review, active cases declined in all the regions except East Africa and North Africa.



# **Central Africa**


#### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa as of September 6, 2020


- As of Sunday, September 6, 2020, the number of total cases in the Central Africa region reached 53,783. The region reported 1,459 new cases in the review week, which is a 61.6% increase compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 1,054, recording 33 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 44,202, of which 1,973 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 8,527 which is a decline of 547 cases in the review week.
- Cameroon accounted for 36.5% of the total cases, while the Republic of Congo accounted for 44.5% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Chad has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,039.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.0%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 7.6% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.





















# **East Africa**

### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa as of September 6, 2020

- As of Sunday, September 6, 2020, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 128,406. The region reported 10,045 new cases in the review week, which is 29.2% lower compared to the number of new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 2,643, recording 173 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 63,751, of which 5,423 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 62,012, which is an increase of 4,449 cases in the review week.
- Ethiopia accounted for 45.7% of the total cases and 75.2% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Seychelles has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 136.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.1%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 6.2% and the lowest in Eritrea and Seychelles, where no deaths have been reported to date.




# **North Africa**

#### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa as of September 6, 2020


- As of Sunday, September 6, 2020, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 248,553. The region reported 20,157 new cases in the review week, which is 18.0% higher compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 8,985, recording 507 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 176,629, of which 17,774 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 62,939, which is an increase of 1,876 cases in the review week.
- Egypt accounted for 40.2% of the total cases, while Morocco accounted for 54.5% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Tunisia has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 5,041.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 3.6%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Egypt at 5.5% and the lowest in Libya at 1.6%.

# **Southern Africa**

#### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa as of September 6, 2020

- As of Sunday, September 6, 2020, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 704,317. The region reported 18,135 new cases in the review week, which is 11.5% lower compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 16,153, recording 922 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 612,359, of which 28,783 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 75,835, which is a decline of 11,570 cases in the review week.
- South Africa accounted for 90.7% of the total cases and 74.2% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritius has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 356.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Angola at 3.9% and the lowest in Botswana at 0.4%.

### West Africa

#### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa as of September 6, 2020

- As of Sunday, September 6, 2020, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 164,460. The region reported 4,323 new cases in the review week, which is 10.1% lower compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 2,465, recording 79 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 139,222, of which 6,066 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 22,773, which is a decline of 1,822 cases in the review week.
- Nigeria accounted for 33.4% of the total cases and 26.4% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Niger has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,177.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.5%. The highest CFRs in the region are reported in Liberia at 6.3% and the lowest in Guinea, Ghana, and Côte d'Ivoire at 0.6%.




