Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa as of June 6, 2021²

Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending June 6, 2021, over 253.5 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, bringing the total given since the start of the pandemic to 2,123,495,588. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 35.9% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by the USA at 14.2% and India at 10.9%.
- The number of African countries that have released data on rolling out Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 44, though the number of countries that have just started their vaccination roll-out could be higher. As of June 6, 2021, a total of 34,600,403 vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 1.6% of total global vaccinations. Morocco accounts for 43.4% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Egypt at 7.8%, Ethiopia (5.2%) and Nigeria (4.7%).

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, June 6, 2021, more than 48.9 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa, of which over 0.9 million were reported in the week under review. Ten countries collectively account for 70.1% of the tests conducted in Africa as of June 6, 2021: South Africa (24.2%), Morocco (13.4%), Egypt (5.9%), Ethiopia (5.6%), Nigeria (4.4%), Kenya (3.7%), Cameroon (3.5%), Zambia (3.3%), Tunisia (3.1%) and Rwanda (3.0%).
- The number of average tests per 1 million people in Africa as of June 6, 2021 stands at 36,584, which is an increase of 2.0% over the figure reported in the previous week. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 497,776 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (415,641), Gabon (369,289), Mauritius (282,029), Seychelles (218,654) and South Africa (200,250).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 173,206,264: the majority of which (30.1%) occurred in Asia, followed by Europe (26.9%), North America (23.0%), South America (17.1%) and Africa (2.8%). To date, 118,823,317 cases have recovered globally, representing 68.6% of confirmed global Covid-19 cases.
- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 3,016,419, indicating a decline of 15.2% compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.

² Tanzania has not released data on Covid-19 since May 08, 2020. Cameroon, Central African Republic, and South Sudan have not released new data for the week under review.

- The number of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 3,726,397, of which 188,200 were recorded in the week ending June 6, 2021; this was more than twice the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases declined by 747,901 cases in the review week, to reach 50,656,550 as of June 6, 2021.
- Africa accounted for 2.8% of the total global cases, 3.6% of deaths, 3.7% of recovered cases and 0.8% of active cases as of June 6, 2021, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of June 6, 2021, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 4,919,397, 76.6% of which were in nine countries, namely South Africa (34.5%), Morocco (10.6%), Tunisia (7.2%), Ethiopia (5.5%), Egypt (5.4%), Libya (3.8%), Kenya (3.5%), Nigeria (3.4%) and Algeria (2.7%). The five countries with the lowest number of cases were Mauritius, Liberia, São Tomé & Príncipe, Guinea-Bissau and Comoros, with cases ranging between 1,458 in Mauritius and 3,888 in Comoros, collectively accounting for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Cabo Verde, Tunisia, South Africa and Libya are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people; rates ranging from 122,380 in Seychelles to 27,142 in Libya.
- In the week under review, a total of 92,506 new cases were reported in Africa, which is a 30.4% increase compared to the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 3.1% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The Southern Africa region accounted for 55.5% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by North Africa (26.3%), East Africa (13.1%), West Africa (2.7%) and Central Africa (2.4%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa increased by 9,473 cases in the review week to reach 384,498. Currently, just seven countries collectively account for 78.5% of the active cases in Africa, namely South Africa (61,557), Egypt (56,016), Kenya (51,609), Cameroon (42,393), Algeria (36,242), Tunisia (31,412) and Ethiopia (22,458).
- From a regional perspective, North Africa accounts for 36.0% of active cases in Africa, followed by East Africa (25.0%), Southern Africa (22.9%), Central Africa (13.1%) and West Africa (3.0%).

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa


• As of June 6, 2021, a total of 132,300 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.2% were in Southern Africa, 33.7% in North Africa, 9.2% in East Africa, 4.8% in West Africa and 2.1% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Egypt, Tunisia, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging from 56,974 in South Africa to 4,209 in Ethiopia. A total of 1,996 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is an increase of 4.4% compared to the preceding week.

• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.7%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 2.2%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.6%, East Africa at 2.0%, North Africa at 3.0% and Southern Africa at 3.1%. As of June 6, 2021, fifteen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 7.6%, followed by Egypt (5.7%), Somalia (5.2%), Zimbabwe (4.1%), Liberia (3.8%), Comoros (3.8%), Tunisia (3.6%), Eswatini (3.6%), Mali (3.6%), Niger (3.5%), Chad (3.5%), South Africa (3.4%), Malawi (3.4%), Lesotho (3.0%) and The Gambia (3.0%).

Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of June 6, 2021, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 4,402,599, which represents 89.5% of its total confirmed cases. Regionally, the recovery levels stand at 96.2% for West Africa, 92.9% for Southern Africa, 87.7% for North Africa, 82.7% for East Africa, and 68.7% for Central Africa. In the week under review 81,037 newly recovered cases were reported.





Central Africa	

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa as of June 6, 2021

- As of Sunday, June 6, 2021, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 169,298. The region reported 2,240 new cases in the review week, which is 8.2% lower compared to the number recorded in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 2,778, recording 29 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 116,237, of which 3.1% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 50,283, indicating a decline of 1,350 cases in the review week. The decline in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to the Republic of Congo and, to a lesser extent, Gabon.
- Cameroon accounted for 46.6% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while the Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 73.4% of the new cases during the week under review. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the Central region since the onset of the pandemic at 4,939.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.6%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 3.5% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.




East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa as of June 6, 2021

- As of Sunday, June 6, 2021, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 624,126. The region reported 12,078 new cases in the review week, which is a 23.7% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 12,209, recording 288 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 515,854, of which 3.1% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 96,063, indicating a decline of 4,399 cases in the review week. The decline in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Ethiopia.
- Ethiopia accounted for 43.7% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Uganda accounted for 52.3% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Comoros has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 3,888.¹
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region increased to 2.0% in the review week. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 7.6% and the lowest in Burundi at 0.2%.




Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa as of June 6, 2021


- As of Sunday, June 6, 2021, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 1,483,186. The region reported 24,324 new cases in the review week, which is a 4.2% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 44,639, recording 773 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,300,219, of which 1.6% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 138,328, indicating an increase of 3,375 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Tunisia followed to a lesser extent by Egypt, Algeria and Libya.
- Morocco accounted for 35.2% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Tunisia accounted for 45.4% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritania has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 19,817.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region currently stands at 3.0%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Egypt at 5.7% and the lowest in Libya at 1.7%.






Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa as of June 6, 2021

- As of Sunday, June 6, 2021, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 2,167,222. The region reported 51,365 new cases in the review week, which is a 56.8% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 66,372, recording 838 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 2,012,707, of which 1.6% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 88,143, indicating an increase of 19,230 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to South Africa.
- South Africa accounted for 78.3% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 73.0% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritius has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,458.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 3.1%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Zimbabwe at 4.1% and the lowest in Mozambique and Mauritius at 1.2%.



West Africa	

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa as of June 6, 2021

- As of Sunday, June 6, 2021, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 475,565. The region reported 2,499 new cases in the review week, which is a 5.8% decline compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 6,302, recording 68 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 457,582, of which 2.1% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 11,681, indicating a decline of 7,383 cases in the review week. The decline in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Nigeria, followed to a lesser extent by Cabo Verde and Togo.
- Nigeria accounted for 35.1% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Cabo Verde accounted for 29.5% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Liberia has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 2,250.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 3.8% and the lowest in Côte d'Ivoire at 0.6%.
