Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa as of June 20, 2021²

Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending June 20, 2021, over 267.9 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, bringing the total given since the start of the pandemic to 2,625,391,424. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 38.5% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by the USA at 12.1% and India at 10.5%.
- The number of African countries that have released data on rolling out Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 45, though the number of countries that have just started their vaccination roll-out could be higher. As of June 20, 2021, a total of 44,303,897 vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 1.7% of total global vaccinations. Morocco accounts for 39.5% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Egypt at 8.6%, Algeria (5.6%) and Nigeria (5.3%).

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, June 20, 2021, more than 51.2 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa, of which over 1.1 million were reported in the week under review. Ten countries collectively account for 69.9% of the tests conducted in Africa as of June 20, 2021: South Africa (24.5%), Morocco (13.1%), Egypt (5.8%), Ethiopia (5.5%), Nigeria (4.4%), Kenya (3.7%), Zambia (3.5%), Cameroon (3.4%), Tunisia (3.1%) and Rwanda (3.0%).
- The number of average tests per 1 million people in Africa as of June 20, 2021 stands at 38,302, which is an increase of 2.3% over the figure reported in the previous week. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 529,420 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (431,962), Gabon (384,622), Mauritius (282,029), Seychelles (218,654) and South Africa (211,596).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 178,433,387: the majority of which (30.4%) occurred in Asia, followed by Europe (26.5%), North America (22.5%), South America (17.7%) and Africa (2.9%). To date, 124,222,460 cases have recovered globally, representing 69.6% of confirmed global Covid-19 cases.
- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 2,545,989, indicating a decline of 5.0% compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week. Continued decline in the number of new cases was recorded globally in the past four weeks.

- The number of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 3,864,703, of which 64,723 were recorded in the week ending June 20, 2021; this was 12.0% lower than the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases declined by 16,044 cases in the review week, to reach 50,346,224 as of June 20, 2021.
- Africa accounted for 2.9% of the total global cases, 3.6% of deaths, 3.7% of recovered cases and 1.0% of active cases as of June 20, 2021, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of June 20, 2021, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 5,201,044, 63.2% of which were in five countries, namely South Africa (35.1%), Morocco (10.1%), Tunisia (7.4%), Egypt (5.3%) and Ethiopia (5.3%). The five countries with the lowest number of cases were Mauritius, São Tomé & Príncipe, Liberia, Guinea-Bissau and Comoros, with cases ranging between 1,701 in Mauritius and 3,908 in Comoros, collectively accounting for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Cabo Verde, Tunisia, South Africa and Namibia are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people; rates ranging from 142,749 in Seychelles to 28,300 in Namibia.
- In the week under review, a total of 159,662 new cases were reported in Africa, which is a 30.9% increase compared to the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 6.3% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. Contrary to the global trend of declining weekly cases in the past four weeks, weekly cases in Africa showed a continued increase mainly reflecting the trend in South Africa. The Southern Africa region accounted for 68.9% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by North Africa (15.5%), East Africa (11.8%), Central Africa (2.0%) and West Africa (1.8%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa increased by 59,688 cases in the review week to reach 490,645. Currently, just six countries collectively account for 69.9% of the active cases in Africa, namely South Africa (117,114), Egypt (55,770), Kenya (52,915), Cameroon (43,754), Algeria (37,619) and Tunisia (35,950).
- From a regional perspective, although all the regions saw increases in active cases, in the review week, 77.9% of the weekly increase is recorded in the Southern Africa region.

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa


• As of June 20, 2021, a total of 137,431deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.2% were in Southern Africa, 33.8% in North Africa, 9.3% in East Africa, 4.6% in West Africa and 2.1% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Egypt, Tunisia, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging from 58,702 in South Africa to 4,283 in Ethiopia. A total of 2,769 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is an increase of 17.2% compared to the preceding week.

• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.6%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 2.2%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.6%, East Africa at 1.9%, Southern Africa at 2.9% and North Africa at 3.0%. As of June 20, 2021, seventeen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 7.5%, followed by Egypt (5.7%), Somalia (5.2%), Zimbabwe (4.0%), Comoros (3.7%), Tunisia (3.7%), Eswatini (3.6%), Mali (3.6%), Niger (3.5%), Chad (3.5%), Malawi (3.3%), Liberia (3.2%), South Africa (3.2%), Lesotho (3.0%), The Gambia (3.0%), Algeria (2.7%) and Senegal (2.7%).

Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of June 20, 2021, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 4,572,968, which represents 87.9% of its total confirmed cases. Regionally, the recovery levels stand at 96.2% for West Africa, 89.9% for Southern Africa, 87.5% for North Africa, 81.2% for East Africa, and 67.5% for Central Africa. In the week under review 97,205 newly recovered cases were reported.





Central Africa	

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa as of June 20, 2021

- As of Sunday, June 20, 2021, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 176,044. The region reported 3,176 new cases in the review week, which is an 11.0% decline compared to the number recorded in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 2,903, recording 51 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 118,790, of which 0.6% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 54,351, indicating an increase of 2,412 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to the Democratic Republic of Congo.
- Cameroon accounted for 45.6% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while the Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 81.3% of the new cases during the week under review. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the Central region since the onset of the pandemic at 4,946.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.6%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 3.5% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.




East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa as of June 20, 2021

- As of Sunday, June 20, 2021, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 659,204. The region reported 18,808 new cases in the review week, which is a 15.6% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 12,812, recording 350 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 535,065, of which 1.9% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 111,327, indicating an increase of 8,322 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Uganda.
- Ethiopia accounted for 41.7% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Uganda accounted for 50.9% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Comoros has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 3,908.¹
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 7.5% and the lowest in Burundi at 0.2%.




Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa as of June 20, 2021


- As of Sunday, June 20, 2021, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 1,533,262. The region reported 24,762 new cases in the review week, which is a 2.2% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 46,391, recording 835 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,342,001, of which 1.6% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 144,870, indicating an increase of 2,235 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Tunisia.
- Morocco accounted for 34.3% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Tunisia accounted for 56.7% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritania has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 20,336.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region currently stands at 3.0%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Egypt at 5.7% and the lowest in Libya at 1.7%.






Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa as of June 20, 2021

- As of Sunday, June 20, 2021, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 2,351,675. The region reported 109,970 new cases in the review week, which is a 47.6% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 68,956, recording 1,504 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 2,114,524, of which 2.9% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 168,195, indicating an increase of 46,508 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to South Africa.
- South Africa accounted for 77.5% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 69.3% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritius has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,701.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Zimbabwe at 4.0% and the lowest in Mauritius at 1.1%.



West Africa	

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa as of June 20, 2021

- As of Sunday, June 20, 2021, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 480,859. The region reported 2,946 new cases in the review week, which is a 25.5% increase compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 6,369, recording 29 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 462,588, of which 0.6% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 11,902, indicating an increase of 211 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Liberia and Sierra Leone offsetting the decline in Guinea.
- Nigeria accounted for 34.8% of the total cases reported in the West region since the start of the pandemic, while Liberia accounted for 15.6% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Liberia has the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 2,995.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Mali at 3.6% and the lowest in Côte d'Ivoire at 0.6%.
