Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa as of July 04, 2021²

Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending July 4, 2021, around 269.6 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, bringing the total given since the start of the pandemic to almost 3.2 billion. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 40.5% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by India at 11% and the USA at 10.3%.
- The number of African countries that have released data on rolling out Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 45, though the number of countries that have just started their vaccination roll-out could be higher. As of July 4, 2021, a total of 50,971,317 vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 1.6% of total global vaccinations. Morocco accounts for 37.7% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Egypt at 8.4%, Nigeria (6.7%) and South Africa (6.5%).

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, July 4, 2021, almost 53.9 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa, of which over 1.3 million were reported in the week under review. Ten countries collectively account for 70.1% of the tests conducted in Africa as of July 4, 2021: South Africa (25.0%), Morocco (12.8%), Egypt (5.6%), Ethiopia (5.4%), Nigeria (4.3%), Kenya (3.7%), Zambia (3.6%), Tunisia (3.3%), Cameroon (3.3%) and Rwanda (3.1%).
- The number of average tests per 1 million people in Africa as of July 4, 2021 stands at 40,241, which is an increase of 2.5% over the figure reported in the previous week. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 562,102 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (441,989), Gabon (401,937), Mauritius (282,029), South Africa (226,780) and Seychelles (218,654).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 183,738,382: the majority of which (30.6%) occurred in Asia, followed by Europe (26.1%), North America (22.1%), South America (18.1%) and Africa (3.1%). To date, 128,671,689 cases have recovered globally, representing 70.0% of confirmed global Covid-19 cases.
- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 2,694,747, indicating an increase of 3.2% compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week. An increase in the weekly number of global cases was recorded in the past two weeks, reversing the declining trend that was observed in the preceding four weeks.

- The number of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 3,976,163, of which 54,091 were recorded in the week ending July 4, 2021; this was 5.7% lower than the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases increased by 441,743 cases in the review week, to reach 51,090,530 as of July 4, 2021.
- Africa accounted for 3.1% of the total global cases, 3.7% of deaths, 3.8% of recovered cases and 1.3% of active cases as of July 4, 2021, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of July 4, 2021, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 5,665,391, 63.5% of which were in five countries, namely South Africa (36.4%), Morocco (9.4%), Tunisia (7.8%), Egypt (5.0%) and Ethiopia (4.9%). The five countries with the lowest number of cases were Mauritius, São Tomé & Príncipe, Guinea-Bissau, Comoros and Liberia, with cases ranging between 1,858 in Mauritius and 4,520 in Liberia, collectively accounting for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Cabo Verde, Tunisia, Namibia and South Africa are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people; rates ranging from 160,236 in Seychelles to 34,347 in South Africa.
- In the week under review, a total of 253,133 new cases were reported in Africa, which is a 19.8% increase compared to the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 9.4% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. Over the past six weeks, the number of new cases in Africa has been showing a steady increase, mainly reflecting the trend in South Africa. The Southern Africa region accounted for 71.2% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by North Africa (19.4%), East Africa (6.5%), West Africa (1.8%) and Central Africa (1.0%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa increased by 75,105 cases in the review week to reach 645,871. Currently, just six countries collectively account for 69.4% of the active cases in Africa, namely South Africa (29.9%), Tunisia (10.2%), Kenya (8.4%), Egypt (8.0%), Cameroon (6.9%) and Algeria (6.0%).
- From a regional perspective, all the regions saw increases in active cases in the review week, the majority (42.2%) of the weekly increase in Africa being in the Southern Africa region followed by North Africa at 27.3%.

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

• As of July 4, 2021, a total of 145,539 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.8% were in Southern Africa, 33.3% in North Africa, 9.4% in East Africa, 4.5% in West Africa and 2.1% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Egypt, Tunisia, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging from 61,840 in South Africa to 4,331 in Ethiopia. A total of 4,421 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is an increase of 19.9% compared to the preceding week.

• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.6%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 2.2%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.7%, East Africa at 2.0%, Southern Africa at 2.8% and North Africa at 3.0%. As of July 4, 2021, seventeen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 7.5%, followed by Egypt (5.8%), Somalia (5.2%), Comoros (3.7%), Eswatini (3.6%), Mali (3.6%), Tunisia (3.5%), Niger (3.5%), Chad (3.5%), Zimbabwe (3.4%), Malawi (3.3%), South Africa (3.0%), The Gambia (3.0%), Liberia (2.9%), Lesotho (2.8%), Algeria (2.7%) and Senegal (2.7%).

Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of July 4, 2021, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 4,873,981, which represents 86.0% of its total confirmed cases. Regionally, the recovery levels stand at 95.7% for West Africa, 87.1% for Southern Africa, 86.1% for North Africa, 80.1% for East Africa, and 66.0% for Central Africa. In the week under review 173,607 newly recovered cases were reported.






Central Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa as of July 4, 2021

- As of Sunday, July 4, 2021, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 181,661. The region reported 2,638 new cases in the review week, which is a 11.4% decline compared to the number recorded in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 3,003, recording 50 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 119,955, of which 0.4% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 58,703, indicating an increase of 2,060 cases in the review week is mainly attributable to the Democratic Republic of Congo.
- Cameroon accounted for 44.5% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while the Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 73.0% of the new cases during the week under review. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the Central region since the onset of the pandemic at 4,951.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.7%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 3.5% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.






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Equatorial Guinea: Total Active Cases

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
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East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa as of July 4, 2021

- As of Sunday, July 4, 2021, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 694,536. The region reported 16,439 new cases in the review week, which is a 13.0% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 13,665, recording 375 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 556,647, of which 2.1% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 124,224, indicating an increase of 4,598 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Rwanda.
- Ethiopia accounted for 39.8% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Rwanda accounted for 36.2% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Comoros has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 3,958.¹
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.0%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 7.5% and the lowest in Burundi at 0.1%.




North Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa as of July 4, 2021

- As of Sunday, July 4, 2021, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 1,617,852. The region reported 49,195 new cases in the review week, which is a 39.0% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 48,415, recording 1,026 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,393,435, of which 1.9% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 176,002, indicating an increase of 21,965 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the review week is mainly attributable to Tunisia.
- Morocco accounted for 33.0% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Tunisia accounted for 74.4% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritania has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 21,076.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region currently stands at 3.0%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Egypt at 5.8% and the lowest in Libya at 1.6%.


Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa as of July 4, 2021

- As of Sunday, July 4, 2021, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 2,682,302. The region reported 180,209 new cases in the review week, which is a 19.8% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 73,977, recording 2,917 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 2,335,962, of which 5.7% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 272,363, indicating an increase of 44,744 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the review week is mainly attributable to South Africa.
- South Africa accounted for 76.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 74.4% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritius has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,858.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.8%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Eswatini at 3.6% and the lowest in Mauritius at 1.0%.




West Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa as of July 4, 2021

- As of Sunday, July 4, 2021, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 489,040. The region reported 4,652 new cases in the review week, which is a 31.8% increase compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 6,479, recording 53 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 467,982, of which 0.6% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 14,579, indicating an increase of 1,738 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Liberia and Senegal.
- Nigeria accounted for 34.3% of the total cases reported in the West region since the start of the pandemic, while Ghana accounted for 20.4% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Guinea-Bissau has the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 3,881.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Mali at 3.6% and the lowest in Côte d'Ivoire at 0.6%.
