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Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa for the Week Ending September 5, 2021 ²

Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending September 5, 2021, over 255.1 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, leading to an accumulated total of almost 5.5 billion since the start of the program. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 38.3% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by India at 12.5% and the USA at 6.8%.
- The number of African countries that have released data on rolling out Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 51. As of September 5, 2021, a total of 107,320,898 vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 2.0% of total global vaccinations. Morocco accounts for 32.3% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by South Africa (12.5%) and Egypt (8.8%).

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, September 5, 2021, almost 68.2 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa, of which over 2.4 million were reported this week. Ten countries collectively account for 69.5% of the tests conducted in Africa as of September 5, 2021 namely, South Africa (24.6%), Morocco (13.4%), Egypt (5.3%), Ethiopia (4.9%), Nigeria (4.1%), Tunisia (3.9%), Rwanda (3.7%), Kenya (3.5%), Zambia (3.4%) and Cameroon (2.8%).
- The average number of tests per 1 million people in Africa as of September 5, 2021 stands at 50,923, which is an increase of 3.7% over the figure reported in the previous week. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 700,716 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (579,541), Gabon (495,239), Mauritius (282,777), South Africa (282,416) and Eswatini (278,447).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 220,642,491, of which 89.3% have recovered. The majority of cases (32.2%) occurred in Asia, followed by Europe (25.3%), North America (22.1%), South America (16.7%) and Africa (3.6%).
- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 4,279,001, indicating a decline of 6.2% compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.
- The number of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 4,578,049, of which 77,452 were recorded in the week ending September 5, 2021; this was 10.9% higher than the number of

deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases increased by 360,497 cases in the week under review making a total of 18,930,764 as of September 5, 2021.

• Africa accounted for 3.6% of the total global cases, 4.4% of deaths, 3.6% of recovered cases and 3.3% of active cases as of September 5, 2021, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of September 5, 2021, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 7,914,377², 66.9% of which were in six countries, namely South Africa (35.6%), Morocco (11.2%), Tunisia (8.5%), Libya (4.0%), Ethiopia (4.0%) and Egypt (3.7%). The five countries with the lowest number of cases were São Tomé & Príncipe, Comoros, Chad, Liberia, and Guinea-Bissau, with cases ranging between 2,683 in São Tomé & Príncipe and 5,882 in Guinea-Bissau, collectively accounting for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Botswana, Cabo Verde, Tunisia and Namibia are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people with rates ranging from 203,343 in Seychelles to 48,405 in Namibia.
- In the week under review, a total of 169,805 new cases were reported in Africa, which is an 21.1% decline compared to the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 4.0% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The Southern Africa region accounted for 42.2% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by North Africa (35.1%), East Africa (11.8%), West Africa (9.5%) and Central Africa (1.4%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa declined by 55,877 cases to 633,117 in the week under review. Currently, six countries collectively account for 64.0% of the active cases in Africa, namely South Africa (22.4%), Libya (13.2%), Algeria (9.1%), Morocco (7.5%), Rwanda (6.8%) and Egypt (4.9%).
- From a regional perspective, Southern Africa, North Africa and West Africa recorded declines in active cases in the last two weeks.

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

- As of September 5, 2021, a total of 199,265 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 52.8% were in Southern Africa, 32.2% in North Africa, 9.1% in East Africa, 4.3% in West Africa and 1.6% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Tunisia, Egypt, Morocco and Algeria, ranging from 83,419 in South Africa to 5,420 in Algeria. A total of 4,435 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a decline of 21.9% compared to the preceding week.
- The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.5%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 2.1%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest



CFR at 1.4%, followed by Central Africa at 1.5%, East Africa at 2.0%, North Africa at 2.7% and Southern Africa at 2.8%. As of September 5, 2021, Eighteen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 7.5%, followed by Egypt (5.8%), Somalia (5.6%), Liberia (4.3%), Comoros (3.6%), Mali (3.6%), Malawi (3.6%), Zimbabwe (3.6%), Chad (3.5%), Tunisia (3.5%), Niger (3.4%), The Gambia (3.3%), South Africa (3.0%), Lesotho (2.8%), Namibia (2.7%), Algeria (2.7%), Angola (2.6%) and Eswatini (2.6%).

Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of September 5, 2021, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 7,081,995, representing 89.5% of its total confirmed cases. Regionally, the recovery rates stand at 92.0% for Southern Africa, 91.6% for West Africa, 87.5% for North Africa, 84.1% for East Africa, and 82.9% for Central Africa. In the week under review, 221,247 newly recovered cases were reported.






Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa for the Week Ending September 5, 2021

- As of Sunday, September 5, 2021, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 205,236. The region reported 2,364 new cases during the week, which is 14.8% higher compared to the number recorded in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 3,170, recording 21 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 170,049, of which 0.1% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 32,017, indicating an increase of 2,102 cases in the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is largely attributed to the Democratic Republic of Congo and Cameroon.
- Cameroon accounted for 41.0% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while the Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 33.8% of the new cases during the week. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the Central region since the onset of the pandemic at 4,996.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.5%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 3.5% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.


East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa for the Week Ending September 5, 2021

- As of Sunday, September 5, 2021, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 889,416. The region reported 20,017 new cases in the week, which is 13.1% lower compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 18,210, recording 339 new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 747,619, of which 2.5% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 123,587, indicating an increase of 1,331 cases in the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Rwanda offsetting the decline recorded in Kenya.
- Ethiopia accounted for 35.4% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 44.3% of the new cases in the region during the week. Comoros has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 4,086.¹
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.0%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 7.5% and the lowest in Burundi at 0.3%.



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
Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa for the Week Ending September 5, 2021


- As of Sunday, September 5, 2021, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 2,395,785. The region reported 59,662 new cases in the week, which is a 24.7% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 64,155, recording 1,530 new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 2,095,908, of which 4.1% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 235,722, indicating a decline of 28,409 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Tunisia and Morocco.
- Morocco accounted for 36.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 51.5% of the new cases in the region during the week. Mauritania has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic which have accumulated to a total of 34,204.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region currently stands at 2.7%. The highest CFR in the region was recorded in Egypt at 5.8% and the lowest in Libya at 1.4%.






Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa for the Week Ending September 5, 2021

- As of Sunday, September 5, 2021, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 3,810,255. The region reported 71,609 new cases in the week, which is a 24.6% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 105,136, recording 2,243 new deaths during week. The total number of recovered cases reached 3,506,246, of which 2.8% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 198,873, indicating a decline of -27,425 cases in the week. Over 50% of the weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is attributable to South Africa, followed by Zimbabwe, Mozambique, Eswatini and Botswana together accounting for the balance.
- South Africa accounted for 74.0% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 76.8% of the new cases in the region during the week. São Tomé & Príncipe has the lowest number of total cases reported in the region at 2,683.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.8%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Malawi and Zimbabwe at 3.6% and the lowest in Mauritius at 0.3%.

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa for the Week Ending September 5, 2021

- As of Sunday, September 5, 2021, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 613,685. The region reported 16,153 new cases during the week, which is a 0.9% increase compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 8,594 of which 305 were new deaths in the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 562,173, of which 3.4% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 42,918, indicating a decline of 3,476 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Senegal and Nigeria.
- Nigeria accounted for 31.9% of the total cases reported in the West region since the start of the pandemic and 25.8% of the new cases in the region during the week. Liberia has the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic which have accumulated to a total of 5,727.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 4.3% and the lowest in Benin and Côte d'Ivoire at 0.8%.
