## Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa for the Week Ending September 19, 2021 <sup>2</sup>

#### Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending September 19, 2021, over 232.7 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, leading to an accumulated total of nearly 6.0 billion since the start of the program. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 36.5% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by India at 13.6% and the USA at 6.5%.
- The number of African countries with data on Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 51. As of September 19, 2021, a total of 130,045,528<sup>2</sup> vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 2.2% of total global vaccinations. Morocco accounts for 28.6% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by South Africa (12.3%) and Egypt (9.4%). According to the latest data from Africa CDC, 3.27% of Africa's population are fully vaccinated of which 3.02% received 2 doses of vaccines. In addition, 5.55% have received one dose and waiting for the second one.

#### Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, September 19, 2021, over 70.9 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa, of which over 1.4 million were reported this week. Nine countries collectively account for 66.7% of the tests conducted in Africa as of September 19, 2021 namely, South Africa (24.5%), Morocco (13.4%), Egypt (5.2%), Ethiopia (4.8%), Nigeria (4.2%), Tunisia (4.0%), Rwanda (3.8%), Kenya (3.5%) and Zambia (3.4%).
- The average number of tests per 1 million people in Africa as of September 19, 2021 stands at 52,960, which is an increase of 2.0% compared to last week. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 728,488 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (608,669), Gabon (517,177), South Africa (292,587), Eswatini (289,908) and Mauritius (282,777).

#### Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 228,501,192, of which 89.8% have recovered. The majority of cases (32.3%) occurred in Asia, followed by Europe (25.1%), North America (22.5%), South America (16.4%) and Africa (3.6%).
- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 3,876,921, indicating a decline of 2.6% compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.

- The number of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 4,691,333, of which 60,956 were recorded in the week ending September 19, 2021; this was 16.5% higher than the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases declined by 231,848 cases in the week under review making a total of 18,677,080 as of September 19, 2021.
- Africa makes 3.6% of the total global cases, 4.4% of deaths, 3.6% of recovered cases and 2.7% of active cases as of September 19, 2021, as detailed below.

#### Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of September 19, 2021, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 8,158,320<sup>3</sup>, 70.0% of which were in seven countries, namely South Africa (35.3%), Morocco (11.3%), Tunisia (8.6%), Ethiopia (4.1%), Libya (4.1%), Egypt (3.6%) and Kenya (3.0%). The five countries with the lowest total number of reported cases were São Tomé & Príncipe, Comoros, Chad, Liberia, and Niger, with cases ranging between 3,043 in São Tomé & Príncipe and 5,957 in Niger, collectively accounting for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Botswana, Cabo Verde, Tunisia and Namibia are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people with rates ranging from 211,360 in Seychelles to 48,834 in Namibia.
- In the week under review, a total of 104,765 new cases were reported in Africa, which is a 19.7% decline compared to the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 2.7% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The Southern Africa region accounted for 38.7% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by North Africa (32.5%), East Africa (17.0%), West Africa (8.9%) and Central Africa (2.9%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa declined by 63,685 cases to 502,913 in the week under review. Currently, six countries collectively account for 62.8% of the active cases in Africa, namely Libya (15.8%), South Africa (12.7%), Algeria (11.5%), Rwanda (9.7%), Egypt (5.9%) and Ethiopia (5.4%).
- From a regional perspective, Southern Africa, North Africa and West Africa recorded declines in active cases in the last four weeks.

#### Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

• As of September 19, 2021, a total of 206,025 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 52.6% were in Southern Africa, 32.2% in North Africa, 9.3% in East Africa, 4.4% in West Africa and 1.6% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Tunisia, Egypt, Morocco and Algeria, ranging from 86,174 in South Africa to 5,694 in Algeria. A total of 3,013 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a decline of 19.6% compared to the preceding week.



• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.5%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 2.1%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.4%, followed by Central Africa at 1.5%, East Africa at 2.1%, North Africa at 2.7% and Southern Africa at 2.8%. As of September 19, 2021, nineteen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 7.6%, followed by Egypt (5.7%), Somalia (5.6%), Liberia (4.8%), Malawi (3.7%), Comoros (3.6%), Mali (3.6%), Zimbabwe (3.6%), Chad (3.5%), Tunisia (3.5%), Niger (3.4%), The Gambia (3.4%), South Africa (3.0%), Lesotho (2.8%), Algeria (2.8%), Namibia (2.7%), Angola (2.7%), Eswatini (2.6%) and Uganda (2.6%).

#### Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of September 19, 2021, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 7,449,382, representing 91.3% of its total confirmed cases. Regionally, the recovery rates stand at 94.5% for Southern Africa, 93.8% for West Africa, 89.4% for North Africa, 83.8% for East Africa, and 81.2% for Central Africa. In the week under review, 165,437 newly recovered cases were reported.






## Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa for the Week Ending September 19, 2021

- As of Sunday, September 19, 2021, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 210,546. The region reported 3,078 new cases during the week, which is a 37.9% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 3,205, recording 22 new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 171,047, of which 0.4% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 36,294, indicating an increase of 2,441 cases during the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is largely attributed to Cameroon, and Gabon to a lesser extent.
- Cameroon accounted for 40.6% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 39.1% of the new cases reported during the week. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the Central region since the start of the pandemic at 5,029.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.5%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 3.5% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.


## **East Africa**

# Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa for the Week Ending September 19, 2021

- As of Sunday, September 19, 2021, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 925,135. The region reported 17,859 new cases in the week, which is 1.0% lower compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 19,067, recording 445 new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 775,093, of which 2.0% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 130,975, indicating an increase of 2,060 cases in the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Rwanda.
- Ethiopia accounted for 36.0% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 55.2% of the new cases in the region during the week. Comoros has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 4,106.<sup>1</sup>
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.1%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 7.6% and the lowest in Burundi at 0.3%.







### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa for the Week Ending September 19, 2021

- As of Sunday, September 19, 2021, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 2,484,545. The region reported 34,000 new cases in the week, which is a 25.9% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 66,331 and recorded 818 new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 2,220,238, of which 2.1% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 197,976, indicating a decline of 13,869 cases during the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Morocco. All countries in the region, except Algeria and Egypt, recorded decline in their active cases.
- Morocco accounted for 37.0% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 44.2% of the new cases in the region during the week. Mauritania has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic which have accumulated to a total of 35,462.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region currently stands at 2.7%. The highest CFR in the region was recorded in Egypt at 5.7% and the lowest in Libya at 1.4%.






# **Southern Africa**

# Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa for the Week Ending September 19, 2021

- As of Sunday, September 19, 2021, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 3,901,747. The region reported 40,542 new cases in the week, which is a 20.4% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 108,392, recording 1,503 new deaths during week. The total number of recovered cases reached 3,686,205, of which 2.3% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 107,150, indicating a decline of -46,581 cases in the week. Around 90% of the weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is attributable to South Africa. All countries in the region, except Angola and São Tomé & Príncipe, recorded increases in active cases of varying degrees.
- South Africa accounted for 73.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 60.3% of the new cases in the region during the week. São Tomé & Príncipe has the lowest number of total cases reported in the region at 3,043.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.8%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Malawi at 3.7% and the lowest in Mauritius at 0.4%.

# Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa for the Week Ending September 19, 2021

- As of Sunday, September 19, 2021, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 636,347. The region reported 9,286 new cases during the week, which is a 30.6% decline compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 9,030, of which 225 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 596,799, of which 2.8% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 30,518, indicating a decline of 7,736 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Senegal, Benin and Nigeria. All countries in the region, except Burkina Faso and Sierra Leone, recorded decline in their active cases.
- Nigeria accounted for 31.7% of the total cases reported in the West region since the start of the pandemic and 28.5% of the new cases in the region during the week. Liberia has the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic with a total of 5,904.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 4.8% and the lowest in Benin at 0.7%.
