## Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa for the Week Ending December 5, 2021

#### Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending December 5, 2021, over 268.7 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, leading to an accumulated total of nearly 8.2 billion since the start of the program. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 31.1% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by India at 15.6% and the USA at 5.6%.
- The number of African countries with data on Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 51. As of December 5, 2021, a total of 246,542,175<sup>1</sup> vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 3.0% of total global vaccinations. Morocco accounts for 19.8% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Egypt (16.5%) and South Africa (10.7%).

#### Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, December 5, 2021, over 82.8 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa, of which more than 0.9 million were reported this week. Nine countries collectively account for 66.3% of the tests conducted in Africa as of December 5, 2021 namely, South Africa (23.5%), Morocco (12.5%), Egypt (6.7%), Ethiopia (4.6%), Nigeria (4.3%), Rwanda (4.2%), Tunisia (3.8%), Kenya (3.4%) and Zambia (3.3%).
- The average number of tests per 1 million people in Africa as of December 5, 2021 stands at 62,768, which is an increase of 1.4% compared to last week. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 796,561 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (677,100), Gabon (633,454), Eswatini (352,337), South Africa (333,203) and Namibia (314,837).

#### Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 265,846,699, of which 90.1% have recovered. The majority cases (31.0%) occurred in Asia, followed by Europe (28.4%), North America (22.4%), South America (14.7%) and Africa (3.3%).
- A new variant of Covid-19, designated by WHO as B.1.1.529 (omicron), has been identified in the last week of November 2021. Studies are underway globally to understand various aspects of the variant. According to latest news quoting WHO, the omicron variant has been detected in around 38 countries. A report, from WHO Africa on December 2, 2021 indicated the variant has been detected in two African Countries, South Africa and Botswana, where 172 and 19 cases were reported respectively.

- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 4,351,841, indicating a 10.1% increase compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.
- The number of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 5,255,545, of which 55,959 were recorded in the week ending December 5, 2021. This was 14.2% higher than the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases increased by 1,002,035 cases in the week under review making a total of 21,141,354 as of December 5, 2021.
- Africa makes 3.3% of the total global cases, 4.3% of deaths, 3.4% of recovered cases and 1.8% of active cases as of December 5, 2021, as detailed below.

#### Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of December 5, 2021, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 8,738,764<sup>2</sup>, 66.6% of which were in six countries, namely South Africa (34.7%), Morocco (10.9%), Tunisia (8.2%), Libya (4.3%), Ethiopia (4.3%) and Egypt (4.2%). The five countries with the lowest total number of reported cases were São Tomé & Príncipe, Comoros, Chad, Liberia, and Sierra Leone, with cases ranging between 3,733 in São Tomé & Príncipe and 6,402 in Sierra Leone. These five countries collectively account for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Botswana, Cabo Verde, Tunisia and Libya are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people with rates ranging from 237,232 in Seychelles to 53,536 in Libya.
- In the week under review, a total of 99,968 new cases were reported in Africa, which is nearly three times higher than new cases recorded the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 2.3% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The Southern Africa region accounted for 79.7% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by North Africa (13.6%), East Africa (3.9%), West Africa (1.8%) and Central Africa (1.0%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa increased by 58,055 cases to 391,001 in the week under review. Currently, five countries collectively account for 67.8% of the active cases in Africa, namely South Africa (21.4%), Algeria (15.4%), Rwanda (13.7%), Egypt (10.5%) and Uganda (6.8%).
- From a regional perspective, all regions except Southern Africa and West Africa recorded declines in active cases during the week.

#### Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

• As of December 5, 2021, a total of 223,492 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.8% were in Southern Africa, 32.8% in North Africa, 10.1% in East Africa, 4.5% in West Africa and 1.8% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Tunisia, Egypt, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging between 89,966 in South Africa and 6,800

in Ethiopia. A total of 919 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a decline of 6.5% compared to the preceding week.


• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.6%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 2.0%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.5%, followed by Central Africa at 1.6%, East Africa at 2.2%, North Africa and Southern Africa at 2.8%. As of December 5, 2021, eighteen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 7.3%, followed by Somalia (5.8%), Egypt (5.7%), Liberia (4.9%), Malawi (3.7%), Niger (3.7%), Tunisia (3.5%), Mali (3.4%), Zimbabwe (3.4%), The Gambia (3.4%), Comoros (3.3%), Chad (3.2%), South Africa (3.0%), Lesotho (3.0%), Algeria (2.9%), Namibia (2.8%), Tanzania (2.8%), and Angola (2.7%).

#### Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of December 5, 2021, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 8,098,731, representing 92.7% of its total confirmed cases<sup>3</sup>. Regionally, the recovery rates stand at 96.9% for West Africa, 94.8% for Southern Africa, 92.7% for North Africa, 88.6% for Central Africa and 82.5% for East Africa. In the week under review, 40,985 newly recovered cases were reported.






# Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa for the Week Ending December 5, 2021

- As of Sunday, December 5, 2021, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 252,958. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 4,912,962 and 33,533 respectively. The region reported 968 new cases during the week, which is a 32.9% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 4,002, of which 30 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 224,242, of which 0.5% were newly recovered cases recorded during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 24,714, indicating a decline of 162 cases during the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Gabon compensating for the increases observed in the rest of the countries in the region excluding Equatorial Guinea.
- Cameroon accounted for 42.4% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 36.6% of the new cases reported during the week. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the Central region since the start of the pandemic at 5,703 of which 85.5% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of December 5, 2021, for the region, stands at 1.6%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 3.2% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.7%.


## **East Africa**

# Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa for the Week Ending December 5, 2021

- As of Sunday, December 5, 2021, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 1,030,881. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 14,992,013 and 39,926 respectively. The region reported 3,924 new cases in the week, which is a 34.9% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 22,653, of which 123 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 850,120¹, of which 0.5% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 132,568, indicating a decline of 555 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Sudan.
- Ethiopia accounted for 36.1% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Sudan accounted for 36.5% of the new cases reported in the region during the week. Comoros has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 4,542 of which 95.0% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of December 5, 2021, for the region, stands at 2.2%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 7.3% and the lowest in Seychelles at 0.5%.




### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa for the Week Ending December 5, 2021


- As of Sunday, December 5, 2021, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 2,658,212. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 22,021,181 and 106,673 respectively. The region reported 13,603 new cases in the week, which is a 0.1% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 73,352, of which 541 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 2,464,061, of which 0.9% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 120,799, indicating a decline of 8,793 cases during the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Libya.
- Morocco accounted for 35.8% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Egypt accounted for 47.4% of the new cases in the region during the week. Mauritania has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic which have accumulated to a total of 39,558 of which 95.8% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of December 5, 2021, for the region, stands at 2.8%. The highest CFR in the region was recorded in Egypt at 5.7% and the lowest in Libya at 1.5%.






# **Southern Africa**

# Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa for the Week Ending December 5, 2021

- As of Sunday, December 5, 2021, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 4,125,279. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 30,777,513 and 144,371 respectively. The region reported 79,640 new cases in the week, which is nearly a five times increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 113,498, of which 189 were new deaths during the week. The total number of recovered cases reached 3,909,472, of which 0.3% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 102,309, indicating an increase of 66,694 cases in the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable South Africa.
- South Africa accounted for 73.5% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 88.3% of the new cases in the region during the week. São Tomé & Príncipe has the lowest number of total cases reported in the region at 3,733 of which 98.4% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of December 5, 2021, for the region, stands at 2.8%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Malawi at 3.7% and the lowest in Mauritius at 1.1%.

## Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa for the Week Ending December 5, 2021

- As of Sunday, December 5, 2021, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 671,434. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 11,331,197 and 28,527 respectively. The region reported 1,833 new cases during the week, which is a 14.9% increase compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 9,987, of which 36 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 650,836, of which 0.1% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 10,611, indicating an increase of 871 cases in the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Mali and Nigeria.
- Nigeria accounted for 32.0% of the total cases reported in the West region since the start of the pandemic, while Mali accounted for 31.4% of the new cases in the region during the week. Liberia has the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic with a total of 5,824 of which 94.8% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of December 5, 2021, for the region, stands at 1.5%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 4.9% and the lowest in Benin at 0.6%.
