Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa for the Week Ending February 20, 2022

Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending February 20, 2022, over 177.7 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, leading to an accumulated total of nearly 10.6 billion since the start of the program. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 29.2% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by India at 16.6% and USA at 5.2%.
- The number of African countries with data on Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 51. As of February 20, 2022, a total of 373,060,504¹ vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 3.5% of total global vaccinations. Egypt accounts for 18.2% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Morocco (14.2%) and South Africa (8.4%). As of February 20, 2022, 11.6% of Africa's population had completed² vaccination and 16.9% had received at least one dose of vaccine.

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, February 20, 2022, nearly 98.5 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa. Nine countries collectively account for 65.2% of the tests conducted in Africa as of February 20, 2022, namely, South Africa (23.2%), Morocco (11.4%), Egypt (6.0%), Rwanda (4.8%), Ethiopia (4.5%), Tunisia (4.3%), Nigeria (4.3%), Kenya (3.4%) and Zambia (3.3%).
- The average number of tests per 1 million people in Africa as of February 20, 2022, stands at 73,552. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 920,928 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (825,832), Gabon (702,152), Eswatini (406,780), South Africa (385,793) and Namibia (372,377).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 424,431,461, of which 82.5% have recovered. The majority cases (35.4%) occurred in Europe, followed by Asia (26.4%), North America (22.1%), South America (12.5%) and Africa (2.6%).
- A new variant of Covid-19, designated by WHO as B.1.1.529 (omicron), was identified in the last week of November 2021. This has contributed to faster spread of Covid-19 in the last three

months. However, there is no detailed information on how much of these new infections are from the new variant.

- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 12,823,056, indicating a 23.7% decline compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.
- The number of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 5,886,419, of which 71,110 were recorded in the week ending February 20, 2022. This was 6.7% lower than the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases declined by 4,838,464 cases in the week under review making a total of 68,555,535 as of February 20, 2022.
- Africa makes 2.6% of the total global cases, 4.2% of deaths, 2.9% of recovered cases and 0.9% of active cases as of February 20, 2022, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of February 20, 2022, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 11,126,015³, 65.0% of which were in six countries, namely South Africa (32.9%), Morocco (10.4%), Tunisia (8.9%), Libya (4.4%), Egypt (4.2%) and Ethiopia (4.2%). The five countries with the lowest total number of reported cases were São Tomé & Príncipe, Chad, Liberia, Sierra Leone and Guinea-Bissau with cases ranging between 5,926 in São Tomé & Príncipe and 7,907 in Guinea-Bissau. These five countries collectively account for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Botswana, Cabo Verde, Tunisia and Libya are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people with rates ranging from 390,224 in Seychelles to 68,969 in Libya.
- In the week under review, a total of 86,291 new cases were reported in Africa, which is 18.0% lower than the new cases recorded the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 0.7% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The North Africa region accounted for 65.1% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by Southern Africa (29.5%), East Africa (3.0%), West Africa (1.7%) and Central Africa (0.7%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa declined by 39,755 cases to a total of 648,286 in the week under review. Currently, six countries collectively account for 55.1% of the active cases in Africa, namely Rwanda (12.7%), Algeria (12.4%), Uganda (9.2%), Ethiopia (7.9%), Egypt (6.9%) and Tunisia (6.0%).
- From a regional perspective, all regions except East Africa recorded declines in active cases during the week.

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

• As of February 20, 2022, a total of 246,854 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.9% were in Southern Africa, 32.8% in North Africa, 10.1% in East Africa, 4.4% in West Africa and 1.8% in Central Africa. The five countries with the

highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Tunisia, Egypt, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging between 98,667 in South Africa and 7,438 in Ethiopia. A total of 2,821 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is an increase of 0.4% compared to the preceding week.

• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.2%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 1.4%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.4%, East Africa at 1.9%, Southern Africa and North Africa at 2.4%. As of February 20, 2022, seventeen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 6.4%, followed by Egypt (5.1%), Somalia (5.1%), Liberia (3.9%), Niger (3.5%), The Gambia (3.1%), Malawi (3.1%), Tunisia (2.8%), Mauritius (2.7%), South Africa (2.7%), Chad (2.6%), Algeria (2.6%), Namibia (2.5%), Mali (2.4%), Tanzania (2.4%), Senegal (2.3%) and Zimbabwe (2.3%).


Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of February 20, 2022, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 10,198,122, representing 91.7% of its total confirmed cases⁴. Regionally, the recovery rates stand at 96.2% for Southern Africa, 95.1% for West Africa, 91.5% for North Africa, 79.6% for Central Africa and 74.9% for East Africa. In the week under review, a total of 123,116 newly recovered cases were reported in Africa.





Central Africa	

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa for the Week Ending February 20, 2022

- As of Sunday, February 20, 2022, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 313,570. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 5,904,935 and 40,304 respectively. The region reported 606 new cases during the week, which is 78.1% lower compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 4,399, of which 8 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 249,510, of which 0.5% were newly recovered cases recorded during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 59,661, indicating a decline of 580 cases during the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Gabon.
- Cameroon accounted for 38.0% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 71.3% of the new cases reported during the week. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the Central region since the start of the pandemic at 7,214 of which 67.6% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of February 20, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 2.6% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.


Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa for the Week Ending February 20, 2022

- As of Sunday, February 20, 2022, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 1,330,208. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 18,436,010 and 49,098 respectively. The region reported 2,608 new cases in the week, which is a 36.7% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 24,866, of which 42 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 996,098¹, of which 0.2% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 276,491, indicating an increase of 21 cases in the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Sudan, Uganda and Ethiopia, offsetting the decline in Seychelles, Kenya and Comoros.
- Ethiopia accounted for 35.2% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 32.5% of the new cases reported in the region during the week. Comoros has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 8,020 of which 97.4% are reported to have recovered.

The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of February 20, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 6.4% and the lowest in Seychelles at 0.4%.




Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa for the Week Ending February 20, 2022


- As of Sunday, February 20, 2022, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 3,421,870. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 24,817,451 and 120,219 respectively. The region reported 56,197 new cases in the week, which is a 17.4% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 81,058, of which 1,002 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 3,131,848, of which 2.6% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 208,964, indicating a decline of 27,488 cases during the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Tunisia followed by Libya and Morocco.
- Morocco accounted for 33.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Tunisia accounted for 34.3% of the new cases in the region during the week. Mauritania has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic which have accumulated to a total of 58,611 of which 98.1% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of February 20, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was recorded in Egypt at 5.1% and the lowest in Libya at 1.3%.



Egypt: Total Active Cases










Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa for the Week Ending February 20, 2022

- As of Sunday, February 20, 2022, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 5,230,771. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 35,787,858 and 169,620 respectively. The region reported 25,416 new cases in the week, which is an 11.7% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 125,591, of which 1,743 were new deaths during the week. The total number of recovered cases reached 5,031,990, of which 0.6% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 73,190, indicating a decline of 8,904 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to South Africa followed by Malawi.
- South Africa accounted for 69.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 65.8% of the new cases in the region during the week. São Tomé & Príncipe has the lowest number of total cases reported in the region at 5,926 of which 98.6% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of February 20, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Malawi at 3.1% and the lowest in Mozambique and Botswana at 1.0%.

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa for the Week Ending February 20, 2022

- As of Sunday, February 20, 2022, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 829,596. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 13,154,580 and 33,118 respectively. The region reported 1,464 new cases during the week, which is 0.8% lower compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 10,940, of which 26 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 788,676, of which 0.5% were newly recovered cases during the period under review. The total number of active cases stands at 29,980, indicating a decline of 2,804 cases in the review period. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Togo followed by Ghana and Mali.
- Nigeria accounted for 30.6% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Ghana accounted for 32.0% of the new cases in the region during the week. Liberia has the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic with a total of 7,360 of which 78.1% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of February 20, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 3.9% and the lowest in Benin at 0.6%.
