## Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa for the Week Ending February 27, 2022

#### Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending February 27, 2022, over 151.7 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, leading to an accumulated total over 10.7 billion since the start of the program. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 29.1% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by India at 16.6% and USA at 5.2%.
- The number of African countries with updated data on Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 51. As of February 27, 2022, a total of 394,159,642<sup>1</sup> vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 3.7% of total global vaccinations. Egypt accounts for 17.6% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Morocco (13.6%) and South Africa (8.0%). As of February 27, 2022, 12.8% of Africa's population has completed<sup>2</sup> vaccination and 18.0% have received at least one dose of vaccine.

#### Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, February 27, 2022, nearly 99.3 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa. Nine countries collectively account for 65.3% of the tests conducted in Africa as of February 27, 2022, namely, South Africa (23.2%), Morocco (11.3%), Egypt (6.0%), Rwanda (4.9%), Ethiopia (4.5%), Tunisia (4.4%), Nigeria (4.3%), Kenya (3.4%) and Zambia (3.3%).
- The average number of tests per 1 million people in Africa as of February 27, 2022, stands at 74,159. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 920,928 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (830,676), Gabon (705,217), Eswatini (411,275), South Africa (389,012) and Namibia (375,398).

#### Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 435,238,168, of which 84.0% have recovered. The majority cases (35.7%) occurred in Europe, followed by Asia (26.7%), North America (21.7%), South America (12.4%) and Africa (2.6%).
- A new variant of Covid-19, designated by WHO as B.1.1.529 (omicron), was identified in the last week of November 2021.

- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 10,806,707, indicating a 15.7% decline compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.
- The number of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 5,948,581, of which 62,162 were recorded in the week ending February 27, 2022. This was 12.6% lower than the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases declined by 4,887,550 cases in the week under review making a total of 63,638,035 as of February 27, 2022.
- Africa makes 2.6% of the total global cases, 4.2% of deaths, 2.8% of recovered cases and 0.9% of active cases as of February 27, 2022, as detailed below.

#### Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of February 27, 2022, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 11,190,629<sup>3</sup>, 65.0% of which were in six countries, namely South Africa (32.8%), Morocco (10.4%), Tunisia (8.9%), Libya (4.4%), Egypt (4.3%) and Ethiopia (4.2%). The five countries with the lowest total number of reported cases were São Tomé & Príncipe, Chad, Liberia, Sierra Leone and Guinea-Bissau with cases ranging between 5,934 in São Tomé & Príncipe and 8,001 in Guinea-Bissau. These five countries collectively account for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Botswana, Cabo Verde, Tunisia and Libya are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people with rates ranging from 394,354 in Seychelles to 70,375 in Libya.
- In the week under review, a total of 63,661 new cases were reported in Africa, which is 27.0% lower than the new cases recorded the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 0.6% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The North Africa region accounted for 56.6% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by Southern Africa (35.8%), East Africa (4.6%), West Africa (2.2%) and Central Africa (0.8%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa declined by 57,083 cases to a total of 576,581 in the week under review. Currently, five countries collectively account for 54.3% of the active cases in Africa, namely Rwanda (14.3%), Algeria (14.0%), Uganda (10.3%), Egypt (8.0%) and Ethiopia (7.7%).
- From a regional perspective, all regions recorded declines in active cases during the week.

#### Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

• As of February 27, 2022, a total of 248,432 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.8% were in Southern Africa, 32.9% in North Africa, 10.1% in East Africa, 4.4% in West Africa and 1.8% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Tunisia, Egypt, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging between 99,229 in South Africa and 7,460

in Ethiopia. A total of 1,572 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a decline of 44.4% compared to the preceding week.

• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.2%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 1.4%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.4%, East Africa at 1.9%, Southern Africa and North Africa at 2.4%. As of February 27, 2022, seventeen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 6.4%, followed by Somalia (5.1%), Egypt (5.0%), Liberia (3.9%), Niger (3.5%), The Gambia (3.1%), Malawi (3.1%), Tunisia (2.8%), South Africa (2.7%), Chad (2.6%), Algeria (2.6%), Mauritius (2.5%), Namibia (2.5%), Mali (2.4%), Tanzania (2.4%), Senegal (2.3%) and Zimbabwe (2.3%).


#### Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of February 27, 2022, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 10,332,794, representing 92.3% of its total confirmed cases<sup>4</sup>. Regionally, the recovery rates stand at 97.4% for West Africa, 96.3% for Southern Africa, 92.4% for North Africa, 83.3% for Central Africa and 75.3% for East Africa. In the week under review, a total of 119,103 newly recovered cases were reported in Africa.






# Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa for the Week Ending February 27, 2022

- As of Sunday, February 27, 2022, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 314,050. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 5,927,376 and 40,457 respectively. The region reported 480 new cases during the week, which is 20.8% lower compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 4,424, of which 25 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 261,738, of which 0.5% were newly recovered cases recorded during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 47,888, indicating a decline of 866 cases during the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Gabon.
- Cameroon accounted for 38.0% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while the Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 34.4% of the new cases reported during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Chad at 7,246 of which 67.3% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of February 27, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 2.6% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.


## Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa for the Week Ending February 27, 2022

- As of Sunday, February 27, 2022, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 1,333,201. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 18,648,508 and 49,664 respectively. The region reported 2,956 new cases in the week, which is an 11.8% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 24,978, of which 111 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,004,349¹, of which 0.8% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 271,052, indicating a decline of 5,476 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Ethiopia.
- Ethiopia accounted for 35.2% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Sudan accounted for 48.6% of the new cases reported in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Comoros at 8,033 of which 97.8% are reported to have recovered.

The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of February 27, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 6.4% and the lowest in Seychelles at 0.4%.

### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa for the Week Ending February 27, 2022


- As of Sunday, February 27, 2022, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 3,457,929. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 24,945,314 and 120,838 respectively. The region reported 36,059 new cases in the week, which is a 35.8% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 81,851, of which 793 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 3,196,276, of which 1.9% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 179,802, indicating a decline of 24,863 cases during the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Tunisia and Libya.
- Morocco accounted for 33.6% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Egypt accounted for 35.5% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Mauritania at 58,632 of which 98.2% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of February 27, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was recorded in Egypt at 5.0% and the lowest in Libya at 1.3%.








# **Southern Africa**

# Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa for the Week Ending February 27, 2022

- As of Sunday, February 27, 2022, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 5,254,187. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 36,446,424 and 170,962 respectively. The region reported 22,764 new cases in the week, which is a 12.7% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 126,216, of which 625 were new deaths during the week. The total number of recovered cases reached 5,060,646, of which 0.6% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 67,325, indicating a decline of 6,517 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to South Africa.
- South Africa accounted for 69.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 64.6% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in São Tomé & Príncipe at 5,934 of which 98.6% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of February 27, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Malawi at 3.1% and the lowest in Mozambique and Botswana at 1.0%.

# Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa for the Week Ending February 27, 2022

- As of Sunday, February 27, 2022, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 831,262. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 13,317,924 and 33,529 respectively. The region reported 1,402 new cases during the week, which is 18.9% lower compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 10,963, of which 18 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 809,785, of which 2.6% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 10,514, indicating a decline of 19,361 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Nigeria.
- Nigeria accounted for 30.6% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Ghana accounted for 49.2% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Liberia at 7,360 of which 78.1% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of February 27, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 3.9% and the lowest in Benin at 0.6%.
