Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa for the Week Ending March 6, 2022

Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending March 6, 2022, over 177.6 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, leading to an accumulated total nearly 10.9 billion since the start of the program. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 29.0% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by India at 16.4% and USA at 5.1%.
- The number of African countries with updated data on Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 51. As of March 6, 2022, a total of 407,171,691¹ vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 3.7% of total global vaccinations. Egypt accounts for 17.4% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Morocco (13.2%) and South Africa (7.9%). As of March 6, 2022, 12.3% of Africa's population has completed² vaccination and 18.6% have received at least one dose of vaccine.

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, March 6, 2022, over 100.1 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa. Nine countries collectively account for 65.3% of the tests conducted in Africa as of March 6, 2022, namely, South Africa (23.2%), Morocco (11.2%), Egypt (6.0%), Rwanda (4.9%), Ethiopia (4.5%), Tunisia (4.4%), Nigeria (4.4%), Kenya (3.4%) and Zambia (3.3%).
- The average number of tests per 1 million people in Africa as of March 6, 2022, stands at 74,789. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 920,928 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (835,243), Gabon (708,317), Eswatini (415,543), South Africa (391,939) and Rwanda (379,742).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 446,232,868, of which 85.0% have recovered. The majority cases (35.8%) occurred in Europe, followed by Asia (27.1%), North America (21.3%), South America (12.3%) and Africa (2.5%).
- A new variant of Covid-19, designated by WHO as B.1.1.529 (omicron), was identified in the last week of November 2021.

¹ The total vaccination figures indicate the total number of vaccines administered including both vaccinations completed and at least one dose.

² Completed vaccination refers to population that has taken the minimum required doses of vaccination depending on the type of vaccine.

- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 10,994,700, indicating a 1.7% increase compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.
- The number of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 5,998,854, of which 50,273 were recorded in the week ending March 6, 2022. This was 19.1% lower than the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases declined by 2,789,698 cases in the week under review making a total of 60,872,193 as of March 6, 2022.
- Africa makes 2.5% of the total global cases, 4.2% of deaths, 2.7% of recovered cases and 0.9% of active cases as of March 6, 2022, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of March 6, 2022, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 11,233,309³, 65.0% of which were in six countries, namely South Africa (32.8%), Morocco (10.3%), Tunisia (8.9%), Libya (4.4%), Egypt (4.4%) and Ethiopia (4.2%). The five countries with the lowest total number of reported cases were São Tomé & Príncipe, Chad, Liberia, Sierra Leone and Comoros with cases ranging between 5,934 in São Tomé & Príncipe and 8,033 in Comoros. These five countries collectively account for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Botswana, Cabo Verde, Tunisia and Libya are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people with rates ranging from 396,544 in Seychelles to 70,857 in Libya.
- In the week under review, a total of 42,657 new cases were reported in Africa, which is 33.0% lower than the new cases recorded the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 0.4% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The North Africa region accounted for 50.9% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by Southern Africa (42.2%), East Africa (4.6%), West Africa (3.2%) and Central Africa (1.1%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa declined by 37,139 cases to a total of 539,367 in the week under review. Currently, five countries collectively account for 57.3% of the active cases in Africa, namely Rwanda (15.3%), Algeria (14.9%), Uganda (11.1%), Egypt (8.4%) and Ethiopia (7.6%).
- From a regional perspective, all regions recorded declines in active cases during the week.

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

• As of March 6, 2022, a total of 249,252 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.8% were in Southern Africa, 33.0% in North Africa, 10.0% in East Africa, 4.4% in West Africa and 1.8% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Tunisia, Egypt, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging between 99,543 in South Africa and 7,476 in

Ethiopia. A total of 820 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a decline of 47.8% compared to the preceding week.

• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.2%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 1.3%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.4%, East Africa at 1.9%, Southern Africa and North Africa at 2.4%. As of March 6, 2022, seventeen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 6.4%, followed by Somalia (5.1%), Egypt (4.9%), Liberia (4.0%), Niger (3.5%), The Gambia (3.1%), Malawi (3.1%), Tunisia (2.8%), South Africa (2.7%), Chad (2.6%), Algeria (2.6%), Namibia (2.6%), Mali (2.4%), Mauritius (2.4%), Tanzania (2.4%), Senegal (2.3%) and Zimbabwe (2.3%).


Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of March 6, 2022, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 10,411,868, representing 92.7% of its total confirmed cases⁴. Regionally, the recovery rates stand at 97.5% for West Africa, 96.5% for Southern Africa, 93.1% for North Africa, 83.6% for Central Africa and 75.6% for East Africa. In the week under review, a total of 78,976 newly recovered cases were reported in Africa.





Central Africa	

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa for the Week Ending March 6, 2022

- As of Sunday, March 6, 2022, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 314,519. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 5,953,579 and 40,636 respectively. The region reported 469 new cases during the week, which is 2.3% lower compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 4,428, of which 4 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 262,835, of which 0.4% were newly recovered cases recorded during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 47,256, indicating a decline of 632 cases during the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Gabon.
- Cameroon accounted for 37.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while the Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 33.0% of the new cases reported during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Chad at 7,255 of which 67.2% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of March 6, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 2.6% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.


East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa for the Week Ending March 6, 2022

- As of Sunday, March 6, 2022, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 1,334,349. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 18,842,454 and 50,181 respectively. The region reported 1,125 new cases in the week, which is a 62.2% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 25,013, of which 35 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,008,572¹, of which 0.4% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 267,942, indicating a decline of 3,035 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Ethiopia.
- Ethiopia accounted for 35.1% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 26.0% of the new cases reported in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Comoros at 8,033 of which 97.8% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of March 6, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 6.4% and the lowest in Seychelles at 0.4%.







Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa for the Week Ending March 6, 2022

- As of Sunday, March 6, 2022, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 3,479,654. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 25,036,220 and 121,279 respectively. The region reported 21,725 new cases in the week, which is a 39.8% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 82,270, of which 419 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 3,241,121, of which 1.4% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 156,263, indicating a decline of 23,539 cases during the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Tunisia and Libya.
- Morocco accounted for 33.4% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Egypt accounted for 40.1% of the new cases followed by Tunisia 34.1% in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Mauritania at 58,649 of which 98.3% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of March 6, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was recorded in Egypt at 4.9% and the lowest in Libya at 1.3%.



Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa for the Week Ending March 6, 2022

- As of Sunday, March 6, 2022, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 5,272,173. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 36,718,078 and 172,236 respectively. The region reported 17,986 new cases in the week, which is a 21.0% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 126,567, of which 351 were new deaths during the week. The total number of recovered cases reached 5,087,600, of which 0.5% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 58,006, indicating a decline of 9,319 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to South Africa.
- South Africa accounted for 69.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 61.5% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in São Tomé & Príncipe at 5,934 of which 98.8% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of March 6, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Malawi at 3.1% and the lowest in Mozambique and Botswana at 1.0%.

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa for the Week Ending March 6, 2022

- As of Sunday, March 6, 2022, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 832,614. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 13,578,938 and 34,186 respectively. The region reported 1,352 new cases during the week, which is 3.6% lower compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 10,974, of which 11 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 811,740, of which 0.2% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 9,900, indicating a decline of 614 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Côte d'Ivoire.
- Nigeria accounted for 30.6% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Ghana accounted for 66.9% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Liberia at 7,384 of which 77.8% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of March 6, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 4.0% and the lowest in Benin at 0.6%.
