Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa for the Week Ending March 13, 2022

Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending March 13, 2022, over 110.1 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, leading to an accumulated total nearly 11.0 billion since the start of the program. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 29.0% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by India and USA at 16.4% and 5.1% respectively.
- The number of African countries with updated data on Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 51. As of March 13, 2022, a total of 418,732,239¹ vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 3.8% of total global vaccinations. Egypt accounts for 17.0% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Morocco (12.9%) and South Africa (7.8%). As of March 13, 2022, 14.3% of Africa's population had completed² vaccination and 19.3% received at least one dose of vaccine.

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, March 13, 2022, nearly 101 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa. Nine countries collectively account for 65.2% of the tests conducted in Africa as of March 13, 2022, namely, South Africa (23.2%), Morocco (11.1%), Egypt (5.9%), Rwanda (4.9%), Ethiopia (4.5%), Nigeria (4.5%), Tunisia (4.4%), Kenya (3.4%) and Zambia (3.3%).
- The average number of tests per 1 million people in Africa as of March 13, 2022, stands at 75,436. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 939,191 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (838,872), Gabon (711,194), Eswatini (419,160) and South Africa (394,718).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 457,948,448, of which 85.5% have recovered. The majority cases (36.0%) occurred in Europe, followed by Asia (27.6%), North America (20.9%), South America (12.0%) and Africa (2.5%).
- A new variant of Covid-19, designated by WHO as B.1.1.529 (omicron), was identified in the last week of November 2021.

¹ The total vaccination figures indicate the total number of vaccines administered including both vaccinations completed and at least one dose.

² Completed vaccination refers to population that has taken the minimum required doses of vaccination depending on the type of vaccine.

- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 11,715,580, indicating a 6.6% increase compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.
- The number of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 6,044,144, of which 45,290 were recorded in the week ending March 13, 2022. This was 9.9% lower than the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases declined by 178,912 cases in the week under review making a total of 60,578,293 as of March 13, 2022.
- Africa makes 2.5% of the total global cases, 4.2% of deaths, 2.7% of recovered cases and 0.9% of active cases as of March 13, 2022, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of March 13, 2022, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 11,283,889³, 65.1% of which were in six countries, namely South Africa (32.7%), Morocco (10.3%), Tunisia (9.1%), Libya (4.4%), Egypt (4.4%) and Ethiopia (4.2%). The five countries with the lowest total number of reported cases were São Tomé & Príncipe, Chad, Liberia, Sierra Leone and Comoros with cases ranging between 5,935 in São Tomé & Príncipe and 8,063 in Comoros. These five countries collectively account for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Botswana, Cabo Verde, Tunisia and Libya are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people with rates ranging from 398,529 in Seychelles to 71,129 in Libya.
- In the week under review, a total of 31,147 new cases were reported in Africa, which is 28.3% lower than the new cases recorded the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 0.3% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The Southern Africa region accounted for 54.1% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by North Africa (37.7%), West Africa (4.0%), East Africa (3.5%) and Central Africa (0.7%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa declined by 36,838 cases to a total of 515,619 in the week under review. Currently, five countries collectively account for 60.0% of the active cases in Africa, namely Rwanda (16.0%), Algeria (15.6%), Uganda (11.6%), Egypt (9.0%) and Ethiopia (7.8%).
- From a regional perspective, all regions except Central Africa recorded declines in active cases during the week.

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

• As of March 13, 2022, a total of 250,875 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.6% were in Southern Africa, 32.9% in North Africa, 10.4% in East Africa, 4.4% in West Africa and 1.8% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Tunisia, Egypt, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging between 99,725 in South Africa and 7,486 in

Ethiopia. A total of 533 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a decline of 38.0% compared to the preceding week.

• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.2%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 1.3%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.4%, East Africa at 1.9%, Southern Africa and North Africa at 2.4%. As of March 13, 2022, sixteen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 7.9%, followed by Somalia (5.1%), Egypt (4.9%), Liberia (4.0%), Niger (3.5%), The Gambia (3.1%), Malawi (3.1%), Mauritius (2.8%), Tunisia (2.7%), South Africa (2.7%), Chad (2.6%), Algeria (2.6%), Namibia (2.5%), Mali (2.4%), Tanzania (2.4%) and Senegal (2.3%).


Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of March 13, 2022, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 10,445,007, representing 92.6% of its total confirmed cases⁴. Regionally, the recovery rates stand at 97.6% for West Africa, 96.7% for Southern Africa, 93.2% for North Africa, 83.6% for Central Africa and 73.7% for East Africa. In the week under review, a total of 67,294 newly recovered cases were reported in Africa.


Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa for the Week Ending March 13, 2022


- As of Sunday, March 13, 2022, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 314,723. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 6,001,999 and 40,967 respectively. The region reported 204 new cases during the week, which is 56.5% lower compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 4,428, no new deaths were reported during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 263,005, of which 0.1% were newly recovered cases recorded during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 47,290, indicating an increase of 34 cases during the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC).
- Cameroon accounted for 37.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while the Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 78.9% of the new cases reported during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Chad at 7,258 of which 67.2% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of March 13, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 2.6% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.


East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa for the Week Ending March 13, 2022

- As of Sunday, March 13, 2022, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 1,335,486. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 19,016,703 and 50,645 respectively. The region reported 1,092 new cases in the week, which is a 0.5% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 25,987, of which 23 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 984,127¹, of which 1.6% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 252,984, indicating a decline of 14,961 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Kenya.
- Ethiopia accounted for 35.1% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 20.0% of the new cases reported in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Comoros at 8,063 of which 97.8% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of March 13, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 7.9% and the lowest in Seychelles at 0.4%.







Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa for the Week Ending March 13, 2022

- As of Sunday, March 13, 2022, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 3,510,787. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 25,156,778 and 121,863 respectively. The region reported 11,747 new cases in the week, which is a 47.8% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 82,551, of which 260 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 3,270,829, of which 0.7% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 157,407, indicating a decline of 12,081 cases during the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Libya and Tunisia
- Morocco accounted for 33.1% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Tunisia accounted for 39.8% followed by Egypt (37.5%) of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Mauritania at 58,658 of which 98.3% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of March 13, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was recorded in Egypt at 4.9% and the lowest in Libya at 1.3%.






Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa for the Week Ending March 13, 2022

- As of Sunday, March 13, 2022, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 5,289,026. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 37,029,091 and 173,695 respectively. The region reported 16,853 new cases in the week, which is a 6.3% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 126,925, of which 240 were new deaths during the week. The total number of recovered cases reached 5,113,342, of which 0.5% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 48,759, indicating a decline of 9,129 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to South Africa followed by Mozambique.
- South Africa accounted for 69.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 60.4% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in São Tomé & Príncipe at 5,935 of which 98.8% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of March 13, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Malawi at 3.1% and the lowest in Mozambique and Botswana at 1.0%.

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa for the Week Ending March 13, 2022

- As of Sunday, March 13, 2022, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 833,867. Total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 13,791,349 and 34,721 respectively. The region reported 1,251 new cases during the week, which is 7.6% lower compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 10,984, of which 10 were new deaths during the week. The number of total recovered cases reached 813,704, of which 0.2% were newly recovered cases during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 9,179, indicating a decline of 701 cases in the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Ghana followed by Côte d'Ivoire.
- Nigeria accounted for 30.6% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Ghana accounted for 55.0% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Liberia at 7,392 of which 77.7% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of March 13, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 4.0% and the lowest in Benin at 0.6%.
