Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa as of April 25, 2021²

Vaccinations: Status Update

- Over 128.6 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally in the week ending April 25, 2021, bringing the total given since the start of the pandemic to 1,023,211,004. In terms of the geographical distribution, the USA accounted for 22.3% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by China at 21.5% and India at 13.8%.
- The number of African countries that have released data on rolling out Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 30, though the number of countries that have just started their vaccination roll-out could be higher. As of April 25, 2021, 16,347,021 vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 1.6% of total global vaccinations. Morocco accounts for 54.7% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date.

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, April 25, 2021, close to 43.8 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa, of which over 1.0 million were reported in the week under review. Ten countries collectively account for 70.5% of the tests conducted in Africa as of April 25, 2021: South Africa (24.1%), Morocco (14.2%), Egypt (6.2%), Ethiopia (5.8%), Nigeria (4.3%), Kenya (3.8%), Zambia (3.2%), Cameroon (3.1%), Rwanda (2.9%) and Tunisia (2.9%).
- The number of average tests per 1 million people in Africa as of April 25, 2021 stands at 32,681, which is an increase of 2.4% over the figure reported in the previous week. Botswana is the best performer on this indicator with 417,624 tests per 1 million people, followed by Gabon (319,255), Cabo Verde (317,176), Mauritius (282,029), Seychelles (218,654), South Africa (177,562) and Morocco (168,563).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 146,830,792: the majority of which (30.0%) occurred in Europe, followed by North America (25.3%), Asia (25.0%), South America (16.5%) and Africa (3.1%). To date, 92,507,727 cases have recovered globally, representing 63.0% of confirmed global Covid-19 cases.
- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 5,705,708, indicating an increase of 8.7% compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.
- The number of global deaths due to Coronavirus reached 3,106,385, of which 88,752 were recorded in the week ending April 25, 2021; this shows an increase of 8.0% over the previous

week. The number of global active cases increased by 1,580,406 cases in the review week, to reach 51,216,680 as of April 25, 2021.

• Africa accounted for 3.1% of the total global cases, 3.9% of deaths, 4.3% of recovered cases and 0.7% of active cases as of April 25, 2021, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of April 25, 2021, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 4,506,744, 77.3% of which were in nine countries, namely South Africa (35.0%), Morocco (11.3%), Tunisia (6.7%), Ethiopia (5.6%), Egypt (4.9%), Libya (3.9%), Nigeria (3.7%), Kenya (3.5%) and Algeria (2.7%). The five countries with the lowest number of cases were Mauritius, Liberia, São Tomé & Príncipe, Eritrea and Guinea-Bissau, with cases ranging between 1,206 in Mauritius and 3,726 in Guinea-Bissau, collectively accounting for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Cabo Verde, South Africa, Libya and Tunisia are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people; rates ranging from 54,474 in Seychelles to 25,681 in Tunisia. The average cases per million, for Africa, stands at 3,445, much lower than the global average of 19,133.
- In the week under review, a total of 75,104 new cases were reported in Africa, which is a 7.8% decline compared to the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 1.3% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The North Africa region accounted for 39.2% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by East Africa (25.1%), Southern Africa (23.6%), West Africa (7.1%) and Central Africa (5.0%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa decreased by 2,465 cases in the review week to reach 367,804. Currently, just seven countries account for 73.5% of the active cases in Africa, namely Ethiopia (55,981), Kenya (47,577), Egypt (42,450), Tunisia (40,892), Algeria (33,416), Cameroon (29,746) and South Africa (20,138).
- From a regional perspective, North Africa accounts for 36.4% of active cases in Africa, followed by East Africa (33.2%), Southern Africa (13.0%), Central Africa (10.8%) and West Africa (6.6%).

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

• As of April 25, 2021, a total of 120,132 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 52.0% were in Southern Africa, 32.5% in North Africa, 8.6% in East Africa, 5.0% in West Africa and 2.0% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Egypt, Tunisia, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging from 54,148 in South Africa to 3,551 in Ethiopia. A total of 2,234 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is an increase of 2.1% compared to the preceding week.

• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.7%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 2.1%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.6% and East Africa at 1.8%, while North Africa at 2.9% and Southern Africa at 3.1% recorded higher CFRs than the African average. As of April 25, 2021, seventeen African countries, namely Sudan (6.8%), Egypt (5.9%), Somalia (5.1%), Liberia (4.1%), Zimbabwe (4.1%), Comoros (3.8%), Eswatini (3.6%), Niger (3.7%), Chad (3.5%), Tunisia (3.4%), South Africa (3.4%), Malawi (3.4%), Mali (3.4%), The Gambia (3.0%), Lesotho (2.9%), Algeria (2.7%) and Senegal (2.7%) recorded CRFs higher than or equal to the average for Africa.

Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of April 25, 2021, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 4,018,808, which is 89.2% of its total confirmed cases. Regionally, the recovery rates were 94.5% for Southern Africa, 93.3% for West Africa, 87.2% for North Africa, 76.4% for East Africa, and 71.5% for Central Africa. In the week under review 75,335 newly recovered cases were reported.







Central Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa as of April 25, 2021

- As of Sunday, April 25, 2021, the number of total cases in the Central Africa region reached 147,238. The region reported 3,779 new cases in the review week, which is a 26.2% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 2,390, recording 84 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 105,297, of which 1,141 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 39,551, which is an increase of 2,554 cases in the review week. This increase is mainly attributable to Cameroon, the Republic of Congo and the Central African Republic.
- Cameroon accounted for 44.8% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and for 31.5% of the new cases during the week under review. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the Central region since the onset of the pandemic at 4,770.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region decreased to 1.6% in the review week. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 3.5% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.



East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa as of April 25, 2021

- As of Sunday, April 25, 2021, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 561,071. The region reported 18,872 new cases in the review week, which is an 18.5% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 10,301, recording 471 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 428,529, of which 21,904 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 122,241, which is a decline of 3,503 cases in the review week. The decline in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Ethiopia and, to a lesser extent, Kenya.
- Ethiopia accounted for 45.0% of the total cases and 54.3% of the new cases in the Eastern region during the week under review. Eritrea has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 3,605.¹
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.8%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 6.8% and the lowest in Burundi at 0.2%.




North Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa as of April 25, 2021

- As of Sunday, April 25, 2021, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 1,346,693. The region reported 29,407 new cases in the review week, which is a 3.3% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 39,002, recording 1,032 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,173,961, of which 25,990 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 133,730 which is an increase of 2,385 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Egypt.
- Morocco accounted for 37.8% of the total cases, while Tunisia accounted for 50.5% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritania has the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 18,257.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region currently stands at 2.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Egypt at 5.9% and the lowest in Libya at 1.7%.




Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa as of April 25, 2021

- As of Sunday, April 25, 2021, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 1,996,256. The region reported 17,746 new cases in the review week, which is a 6.0% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 62,437, recording 563 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,885,986, of which 20,750 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 47,833, which is a decline of 3,567 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Mozambique, although South Africa still has the largest number of active cases at 20,138.
- South Africa accounted for 78.9% of the total cases and 49.0% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritius has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,206.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 3.1%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Zimbabwe at 4.1% and the lowest in Mozambique at 1.2%.




Botswana: Total Active Cases



Madagascar: Total Active Cases



















West Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa as of April 25, 2021

- As of Sunday, April 25, 2021, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 455,486. The region reported 5,300 new cases in the review week, which is an 8.8% decline compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 6,002, recording 84 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 425,035, of which 5,550 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 24,449, which is a decline of 334 cases in the review week. The decline in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Mali and Benin.
- Nigeria accounted for 36.2% of the total cases, while Cabo Verde accounted for 35.5% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Liberia has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 2,097.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 4.1% and the lowest in Côte d'Ivoire and Guinea at 0.6%.
