Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa for the Week Ending May 15, 2022

Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending May 15, 2022, over 71.8 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, leading to a cumulative total of nearly 11.8 billion since the start of the program. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 28.9% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by India at 16.2% and the USA at 4.9%.
- The number of African countries with data on Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 51, of which only 14 released new data on the progress of the vaccination program this week. As of May 15, 2022, a cumulative total of 488,993,534¹ vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 4.2% of total global vaccinations. Egypt accounts for 16.8% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Morocco (11.1%), Nigeria (8.4%) and South Africa (7.2%). As of May 15, 2022, 16.9% of Africa's population had completed² a course of vaccination and 22.3% had received at least one dose of vaccine.

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, May 15, 2022, over 106.7 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa. Nine countries collectively account for 64.8% of all the tests conducted in Africa by May 15, 2022, namely, South Africa (23.3%), Morocco (10.8%), Egypt (5.7%), Rwanda (5.0%), Nigeria (4.8%), Ethiopia (4.5%), Tunisia (4.3%), Kenya (3.4%) and Zambia (3.2%).
- The average number of tests per 1 million people in Africa as of May 15, 2022, stands at 79,739. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 968,092 tests per 1 million people, followed by Eswatini (880,638), Cabo Verde (870,616), Gabon (716,403), South Africa (419,593) and Rwanda (412,899).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 521,467,180, of which 94.4% have recovered. The majority cases (37.3%) occurred in Europe, followed by Asia (28.8%), North America (19.1%), South America (11.0%) and Africa (2.2%).
- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 4,117,991, indicating an 18.2% increase compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.

¹ The total vaccination figures indicate the total number of vaccines administered including both vaccinations completed and vaccines of at least one dose.

² Completed vaccination refers to population that have taken the minimum required doses of vaccination, depending on the type of vaccine.

- The cumulative total of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 6,263,879, of which 12,559 were recorded in the week ending May 15, 2022. This was 14.9% lower than the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases decreased by 546,923 cases in the week under review, bringing the total, as of May 15, 2022, to 23,160,903.
- Africa accounts for 2.2% of the total global cases, 4.0% of total global deaths due to Covid-19, 2.2% of global recovered cases and 2.1% of active cases as of May 15, 2022, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of May 15, 2022, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 11,603,921,³ 65.3% of which were in six countries, namely South Africa (33.5%), Morocco (10.0%), Tunisia (9.0%), Egypt (4.4%), Libya (4.3%) and Ethiopia (4.1%). The five countries with the lowest number of reported cases since the start of the pandemic were São Tomé & Príncipe, Chad, Liberia, Sierra Leone and Comoros, with cases ranging between 5,970 in São Tomé & Príncipe and 8,100 in Comoros. These five countries collectively account for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Botswana, Cabo Verde, Tunisia and Libya are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per 1 million people, with rates ranging from 447,495 in Seychelles to 71,237 in Libya.
- In the week under review, a total of 58,728 new cases were reported in Africa, which is 17.6% higher than new cases recorded in the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 1.4% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The Southern Africa region accounted for 91.9% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by East Africa (5.2%), North Africa (2.0%), West Africa (0.9%) and Central Africa (0.01%).
- The number of active cases in Africa increased by 3,888 in the week ending May 15, 2022, indicating a cumulative total of 495,593 active cases. Currently, five countries collectively account for 71.3% of the active cases in Africa, namely Rwanda (16.7%), Algeria (16.3%), South Africa (16.2%), Uganda (12.2%) and Egypt (9.9%).
- All the regions, except Southern and East Africa, recorded a decline in active cases, to varying degrees, during the review week.

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

• As of May 15, 2022, a total of 253,376 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.6% were in Southern Africa, 33.0% in North Africa, 10.3% in East Africa, 4.3% in West Africa, and 1.8% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Tunisia, Egypt, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging from 100,755 in South Africa to 7,510 in

Ethiopia. A total of 302 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a 50.2% increase compared to the number recorded in the preceding week.

• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.2%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 1.2%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.4%, East Africa at 1.9%, Southern Africa at 2.3% and North Africa at 2.4%. As of May 15, 2022, sixteen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 7.9%, followed by Somalia (5.1%), Egypt (4.8%), Liberia (3.9%), Niger (3.4%), Malawi (3.1%), The Gambia (3.0%), Tunisia (2.7%), Mauritius (2.6%), South Africa (2.6%), Chad (2.6%), Algeria (2.6%), Namibia (2.5%), Mali (2.4%), Tanzania (2.4%) and Senegal (2.3%).


Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of May 15, 2022, the cumulative total of recovered cases in Africa reached 10,746,510, representing 92.6% of its confirmed cases.⁴ Regionally, the recovery rates stand at 98.0% for West Africa, 95.9% for Southern Africa, 93.4% for North Africa, 83.3% for Central Africa and 75.9% for East Africa. In the week under review, a total of 36,367 newly recovered cases were reported in Africa.

⁴ Burundi has not been publishing new data on recovered cases and deaths since 6 January 21. Tanzania and Sudan are not currently reporting on recovered cases. Additionally, Liberia, Benin, Rwanda, South Sudan, Somalia, CAR, Chad and DRC have not reported recovered cases for several weeks.


Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa for the Week Ending May 15, 2022


- As of May 15, 2022, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 316,463. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people in the region, stood at 6,299,096 and 42,994 respectively. The region reported 8 new cases during the week.¹
- The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 4,442, with no new deaths reported during the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 263,630, of which 12 were newly recovered cases recorded during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 48,391, indicating a decline of 4 cases during the review week, which is attributable to Gabon.
- Cameroon accounted for 37.8% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Gabon accounted for 6 of the 8 new cases reported during the week. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic, at 7,414.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of May 15, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 2.6% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.


East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa for the Week Ending May 15, 2022

- As of Sunday, May 15, 2022, the cumulative number of total cases in the East Africa region since the start of the pandemic reached 1,348,694. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 20,177,931 and 53,737 respectively. The region reported 3,078 new cases in the review week, which is a more than double the increase recorded for new cases in the preceding week.
- The total number of deaths reported reached 26,137, with 43 new deaths occurring during the week ending May 15, 2022. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,023,373,¹ of which 1,116 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases in the region currently stands at 207,445, indicating an increase of 451 cases in the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Ethiopia.
- Ethiopia accounted for 34.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Tanzania accounted for 48.1% of the new cases reported in the region during the review week. Comoros has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 8,100, of which 97.9% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the East Africa region, based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of May 15, 2022, stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 7.9% and the lowest in Seychelles at 0.4%.







Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa for the Week Ending May 15, 2022

- As of Sunday, May 15, 2022, the cumulative total cases reported in the North Africa region reached 3,549,227, since the start of the pandemic. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 25,905,696 and 125,490 respectively. The region reported 1,166 new cases in the review week, which is a 33.1% increase compared to the preceding week.
- The cumulative total deaths reported for the region reached 83,546, of which 10 were new deaths during the week ending May 15, 2022. The cumulative total number of recovered cases since the start of the pandemic reached 3,314,229, of which 705 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The cumulative total of active cases stands at 134,749, indicating a decline of 16,252 cases during the week. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is attributable to Tunisia.
- Morocco accounted for 32.8% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 47.0% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Mauritania at 58,853, of which 98.1% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of May 15, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was recorded in Egypt at 4.8% and the lowest in Libya at 1.3%.






Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa for the Week Ending May 15, 2022

- As of Sunday, May 15, 2022, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 5,551,401. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the Southern region, stand at 39,630,065 and 185,896 respectively. The region reported 53,965 new cases in the review week, which is a 13.5% increase compared to the preceding week.
- The total number of deaths reported reached 128,237, of which 247 were new deaths during the week. The total number of recovered cases reached 5,324,297, of which 33,712 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 98,867, indicating an increase of 20,006 cases in the review week, which is mainly attributable to South Africa.
- As of May 15, 2022, South Africa accounted for 70.1% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 93.4% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in São Tomé & Príncipe at 5,970 of which 98.7% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the Southern region, based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of May 15, 2022, stands at 2.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Malawi at 3.1% and the lowest in Botswana at 0.9%.

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa for the Week Ending May 15, 2022

- As of Sunday, May 15, 2022, the cumulative number of Covid-19 cases in the West Africa region had reached 838,136. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the West Africa region, stand at 14,743,253 and 37,117 respectively. The region reported 511 new cases during the week, which is more than double compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week.
- The total number of deaths reported reached 11,014 with 2 new deaths reported during the review week. The total number of recovered cases since the start of the pandemic reached 820,981, of which 822 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 6,141, indicating a decline of 313 cases in the week ending May 15, 2022. The weekly decline in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Guinea-Bissau.
- Nigeria accounted for 30.5% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 18.2% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Liberia at 7.451.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of May 15, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 3.9% and the lowest in Benin at 0.6%.
