Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa for the Week Ending May 29, 2022

Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending May 29, 2022, over 126.6 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were reported to have been administered globally, leading to a cumulative total of nearly 12 billion since the start of the program. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 28.9% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by India at 16.3% and the USA at 4.9%.
- The number of African countries with data on Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 51, of which 30 released new data on the progress of the vaccination program this week. As of May 29, 2022, a cumulative total of 502,857,594¹ vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 4.2% of total global vaccinations. Egypt accounts for 16.5% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Morocco (10.9%), Nigeria (8.7%) and South Africa (7.2%). As of May 29, 2022, 17.3% of Africa's population had completed² a course of vaccination and 22.7% had received at least one dose of vaccine.

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, May 29, 2022, nearly 107.9 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa. Nine countries collectively account for 64.9% of all the tests conducted in Africa by May 29, 2022, namely, South Africa (23.4%), Morocco (10.8%), Egypt (5.7%), Rwanda (5.0%), Nigeria (4.8%), Ethiopia (4.5%), Tunisia (4.3%), Kenya (3.4%) and Zambia (3.2%).
- The average number of tests per 1 million people in Africa as of May 29, 2022, stands at 80,574. Botswana continues to lead on this indicator with 971,736 tests per 1 million people, followed by Eswatini (885,223), Cabo Verde (870,616), Gabon (716,403), South Africa (425,435) and Rwanda (418,650).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

• Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 528,990,525³, of which 94.5% have recovered. The majority cases (36.9%) occurred in Europe, followed by Asia (29.3%), North America (19.1%), South America (10.8%) and Africa (2.2%).

¹ The total vaccination figures indicate the total number of vaccines administered including both vaccinations completed and vaccines of at least one dose.

² Completed vaccination refers to population that have taken the minimum required doses of vaccination, depending on the type of vaccine.

³ Due to irregular reporting from countries and because not all cases are reported to health facilities, the total figure is believed to be underestimated globally.

- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 3,387,103, indicating an 18.1% decline compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.
- The cumulative total of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 6,287,747, of which 10,565 were recorded in the week ending May 29, 2022. This was 20.6% lower than the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases decreased by 1,022,803 cases in the week under review, bringing the total, as of May 29, 2022, to 22,872,997.
- Africa accounts for 2.2% of the total global cases, 4.0% of total global deaths due to Covid-19, 2.2% of global recovered cases and 2.1% of active cases as of May 29, 2022, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of May 29, 2022, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 11,687,658,4 65.4% of which were in six countries, namely South Africa (33.8%), Morocco (10.0%), Tunisia (8.9%), Egypt (4.4%), Libya (4.3%) and Ethiopia (4.0%). The five countries with the lowest number of reported cases since the start of the pandemic were São Tomé & Príncipe, Chad, Liberia, Sierra Leone and Comoros, with cases ranging between 5,982 in São Tomé & Príncipe and 8,100 in Comoros. These five countries collectively account for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Botswana, Cabo Verde, Tunisia and Libya are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per 1 million people, with rates ranging from 441,772 in Seychelles to 71,201 in Libya.
- In the week under review, a total of 33,569 new cases were reported in Africa, which is 33.0% lower than new cases recorded in the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 1.0% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The Southern Africa region accounted for 83.9% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by East Africa (6.9%), North Africa (5.9%), Central Africa (1.7%) and West Africa (1.5%).
- The number of active cases in Africa decreased by 7,856 in the week ending May 29, 2022, indicating a cumulative total of 486,801 active cases. Currently, five countries collectively account for 66.2% of the active cases in Africa, namely Rwanda (17.1%), Algeria (16.6%), Uganda (12.4%), South Africa (10.1%) and Egypt (10.0%).
- All the regions, except Southern Africa, recorded an increase in active cases, to varying degrees, during the review week.

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

• As of May 29, 2022, a total of 253,892 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.7% were in Southern Africa, 32.9% in North Africa, 10.3% in East Africa, 4.3% in West Africa, and 1.8% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest

number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Tunisia, Egypt, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging from 101,146 in South Africa to 7,513 in Ethiopia. A total of 251 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a 5.3% decline compared to the number recorded in the preceding week.


• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.2%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 1.2%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.4%, East Africa at 1.9%, Southern Africa at 2.3% and North Africa at 2.4%. As of May 29, 2022, sixteen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 7.9%, followed by Somalia (5.1%), Egypt (4.8%), Liberia (3.9%), Niger (3.4%), Malawi (3.1%), The Gambia (3.0%), Tunisia (2.7%), Mauritius (2.6%), South Africa (2.6%), Chad (2.6%), Algeria (2.6%), Namibia (2.4%), Mali (2.4%), Tanzania (2.4%) and Senegal (2.3%).

Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of May 29, 2022, the cumulative total of recovered cases in Africa reached 10,855,141, representing 92.9% of its confirmed cases.⁵ Regionally, the recovery rates stand at 97.9% for West Africa, 96.5% for Southern Africa, 93.4% for North Africa, 83.0% for Central Africa and 75.8% for East Africa. In the week under review, a total of 41,138 newly recovered cases were reported in Africa.

⁵ Burundi has not been publishing new data on recovered cases and deaths since 6 January 21. Tanzania and Sudan are not currently reporting on recovered cases. Additionally, Liberia, Benin, Rwanda, South Sudan, Somalia, CAR, Chad and DRC have not reported recovered cases for several weeks.






Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa for the Week Ending May 29, 2022

- As of May 29, 2022, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 317,665. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people in the region, stood at 6,350,685 and 43,347 respectively. The region reported 577 new cases during the week.
- The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 4,446, with 3 new deaths reported during the review week. The number of total recovered cases was 263,639, no newly recovered cases are reported during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 49,580, indicating an increase of 574 cases during the review week, which is mainly attributable to the Democratic Republic of Congo followed by Cameroon.
- Cameroon accounted for 37.8% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while the Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 69.8% of the new cases reported during the week. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic, at 7,417.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of May 29, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 2.6% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.

East Africa


Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa for the Week Ending May 29, 2022

- As of Sunday, May 29, 2022, the cumulative number of total cases in the East Africa region since the start of the pandemic reached 1,352,600. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 20,587,318 and 54,828 respectively. The region reported 2,331 new cases in the review week, which is a 48.0% increase compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.
- The total number of deaths reported reached 26,151, with 9 new deaths occurring during the week ending May 29, 2022. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,025,612,¹ of which 1,294 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases in the region currently stands at 209,013, indicating an increase of 992 cases in the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Ethiopia.
- Ethiopia accounted for 34.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 36.9% of the new cases reported in the region during the review week. Comoros has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 8,100, of which 97.9% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR)² for the East Africa region, based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of May 29, 2022, stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 7.9% and the lowest in Seychelles at 0.4%.




Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa for the Week Ending May 29, 2022

- As of Sunday, May 29, 2022, the cumulative total cases reported in the North Africa region reached 3,552,884, since the start of the pandemic. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 25,991,937 and 125,908 respectively. The region reported 1,989 new cases in the review week, which is a 19.2% increase compared to the preceding week.
- The cumulative total deaths reported for the region reached 83,608, of which 5 were new deaths during the week ending May 29, 2022. The cumulative total number of recovered cases since the start of the pandemic reached 3,316,775, of which 1,450 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The cumulative total of active cases stands at 152,501, indicating an increase of 534 cases during the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Morocco.
- Morocco accounted for 32.9% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 63.7% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Mauritania at 59,123, of which 97.9% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of May 29, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was recorded in Egypt at 4.8% and the lowest in Libya at 1.3%.






Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa for the Week Ending May 29, 2022

- As of Sunday, May 29, 2022, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 5,625,397. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the Southern region, stand at 40,085,978 and 188,035 respectively. The region reported 28,164 new cases in the review week, which is a 38.5% decline compared to the preceding week.
- The total number of deaths reported reached 128,672, of which 234 were new deaths during the week. The total number of recovered cases reached 5,427,335, of which 38,069 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 69,390, indicating a decline of 10,139 cases in the review week, which is mainly attributable to South Africa.
- As of May 29, 2022, South Africa accounted for 70.3% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 85.6% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in São Tomé & Príncipe at 5,982 of which 98.6% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the Southern region, based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of May 29, 2022, stands at 2.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Malawi at 3.1% and the lowest in Botswana at 0.9%.

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa for the Week Ending May 29, 2022

- As of Sunday, May 29, 2022, the cumulative number of Covid-19 cases in the West Africa region had reached 839,112. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the West Africa region, stand at 14,858,872 and 37,409 respectively. The region reported 508 new cases during the week, which is an 8.5% increase compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week.
- The total number of deaths reported reached 11,015 with no new deaths reported during the review week. The total number of recovered cases since the start of the pandemic reached 821,780, of which 325 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 6,317, indicating an increase of 183 cases in the week ending May 29, 2022. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Cabo Verde, Nigeria and Côte d'Ivoire.
- Nigeria accounted for 30.5% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Côte d'Ivoire accounted for 29.3% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Liberia at 7,455.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of May 29, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 3.9% and the lowest in Benin at 0.6%.
