Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa for the Week Ending June 12, 2022

Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending June 12, 2022, 44.5 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were reported to have been administered globally, leading to a cumulative total of nearly 12 billion since the start of the program. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 28.4% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by India at 16.4% and the USA at 4.9%.
- The number of African countries with data on Covid-19 vaccinations stands at 51, of which only 21 released new data on the progress of the vaccination program this week. As of June 12, 2022, a cumulative total of 512,003,362¹ vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 4.3% of total global vaccinations. Egypt accounts for 16.7% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Morocco (10.7%), Nigeria (8.6%) and South Africa (7.1%). As of June 12, 2022, 19.0% of Africa's population had completed² a course of vaccination and 24.3% had received at least one dose of vaccine.

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, June 12, 2022, over 110.0 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa. Nine countries collectively account for 64.5% of all the tests conducted in Africa by June 12, 2022, namely, South Africa (23.2%), Morocco (10.7%), Egypt (5.6%), Rwanda (5.0%), Nigeria (4.7%), Ethiopia (4.5%), Tunisia (4.2%), Kenya (3.4%) and Zambia (3.2%).
- The average number of tests per 1 million people in Africa as of June 12, 2022, stands at 82,193. Mauritius is leading on this indicator with 1,008,450 tests per 1 million people, followed by Botswana (971,736), Eswatini (889,003), Cabo Verde (884,647), Gabon (718,412), South Africa (429,871) and Rwanda (424,005).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

• Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 535,245,816³, of which 95.4% have recovered. The majority cases (36.8%) occurred in Europe, followed by Asia (29.4%), North America (19.1%), South America (10.8%) and Africa (2.2%).

¹ The total vaccination figures indicate the total number of vaccines administered, including both vaccinations completed and vaccines of at least one dose.

² Completed vaccination refers to population that have taken the minimum required doses of vaccination, depending on the type of vaccine.

³ Due to irregular reporting from countries and because not all cases are reported to health facilities, the total figure is believed to be underestimated globally.

- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 3,301,180, indicating an 11.7% increase compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.
- The cumulative total of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 6,309,204, of which 10,160 were recorded in the week ending June 12, 2022. This was 10.1% lower than the number of deaths recorded in the previous week. The number of global active cases decreased by 129,929 cases in the week under review, bringing the total, as of June 12, 2022, to 18,477,007.
- Africa accounts for 2.2% of the total global cases, 4.0% of total global deaths due to Covid-19, 2.1% of global recovered cases and 2.6% of active cases as of June 12, 2022, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of June 12, 2022, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 11,749,328,4 65.6% of which were in six countries, namely South Africa (33.9%), Morocco (10.0%), Tunisia (8.9%), Egypt (4.4%), Libya (4.3%) and Ethiopia (4.1%). The six countries with the lowest number of reported cases since the start of the pandemic were São Tomé & Príncipe, Chad, Liberia, Sierra Leone, Comoros and Guinea-Bissau, with cases ranging between 6,003 in São Tomé & Príncipe and 8,306 in Guinea-Bissau. These six countries collectively account for 0.4% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Botswana, Cabo Verde, Tunisia, Libya and South Africa are the six countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per 100,000 people, with rates ranging from 44,573 in Seychelles to 6,548 in South Africa.
- In the week under review, a total of 31,606 new cases were reported in Africa, which is 2.9% higher than new cases recorded in the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 1.0% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The Southern Africa region accounted for 53.5% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by East Africa (20.5%), North Africa (19.5%), West Africa (3.9%) and Central Africa (2.5%).
- The number of active cases in Africa decreased by 848 in the week ending June 12, 2022, indicating a cumulative total of 475,263 active cases. Currently, five countries collectively account for 65.8% of the active cases in Africa, namely Rwanda (17.5%), Algeria (17.0%), Uganda (13.1%), Egypt (10.3%) and the Democratic Republic of Congo (7.9%).
- Southern Africa recorded a decline in active cases, while an increase was observed in the rest of the regions, during the review week.

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa

• As of June 12, 2022, a total of 254,327 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.7% were in Southern Africa, 32.9% in North Africa, 10.3% in East

Africa, 4.3% in West Africa, and 1.8% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Tunisia, Egypt, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging from 101,484 in South Africa to 7,516 in Ethiopia. A total of 222 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a 1.4% increase compared to the number recorded in the preceding week.


• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.2%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 1.2%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.4%, East Africa at 1.9%, Southern Africa and North Africa at 2.3%. As of June 12, 2022, sixteen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with the highest in Sudan at 7.9%, followed by Somalia (5.1%), Egypt (4.8%), Liberia (3.9%), Niger (3.4%), Malawi (3.1%), The Gambia (3.0%), Tunisia (2.7%), Mauritius (2.6%), South Africa (2.6%), Chad (2.6%), Algeria (2.6%), Namibia (2.4%), Mali (2.4%), Tanzania (2.4%) and Senegal (2.3%).

Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of June 12, 2022, the cumulative total of recovered cases in Africa reached 10,927,730, representing 93.0% of its confirmed cases.⁵ Regionally, the recovery rates stand at 97.8% for West Africa, 97.0% for Southern Africa, 93.2% for North Africa, 82.5% for Central Africa and 75.3% for East Africa. In the week under review, a total of 32,170 newly recovered cases were reported in Africa.





Central Africa	

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa for the Week Ending June 12, 2022

- As of June 12, 2022, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 319,722. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people in the region, stood at 6,390,299 and 43,617 respectively. The region reported 791 new cases during the week.
- The total number of deaths reported since the start of the pandemic reached 4,453, with 7 new deaths reported during the review week. The number of total recovered cases was 263,665, with 17 newly recovered cases reported during the week. The total number of active cases stands at 51,604, indicating an increase of 767 cases during the review week, which is mainly attributable to the Democratic Republic of Congo.
- Cameroon accounted for 37.5% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while the Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 93.9% of the new cases reported during the week. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic, at 7,418.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of June 12, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 2.6% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.


Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa for the Week Ending June 12, 2022

- As of Sunday, June 12, 2022, the cumulative number of total cases in the East Africa region since the start of the pandemic reached 1,364,652. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 20,870,899 and 55,583 respectively. The region reported 6,495 new cases in the review week, which is a 12.2% increase compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.
- The total number of deaths reported reached 26,161, with 9 new deaths occurring during the week ending June 12, 2022. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,028,190,¹ of which 1,792 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases in the region currently stands at 218,293, indicating an increase of 4,632 cases in the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Ethiopia.
- Ethiopia accounted for 35.1% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 60.8% of the new cases reported in the region during the review week. Comoros has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 8,100, of which 97.9% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR)² for the East Africa region, based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of June 12, 2022, stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 7.9% and the lowest in Seychelles at 0.4%.




Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa for the Week Ending June 12, 2022


- As of Sunday, June 12, 2022, the cumulative total cases reported in the North Africa region reached 3,562,003, since the start of the pandemic. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the region, stand at 26,304,442 and 127,422 respectively. The region reported 6,156 new cases in the review week, which is more than double the increase reported in the preceding week.
- The cumulative total deaths reported for the region reached 83,630, of which 9 were new deaths during the week ending June 12, 2022. The cumulative number of recovered cases since the start of the pandemic reached 3,321,559, of which 2,727 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The cumulative total of active cases stands at 156,814, indicating an increase of 3,420 cases during the week. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Morocco, followed by Libya.
- Morocco accounted for 33.0% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 87.9% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in Mauritania at 59,247, of which 98.1% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of June 12, 2022, for the region, stands at 2.3%. The highest CFR in the region was recorded in Egypt at 4.8% and the lowest in Libya at 1.3%.



Egypt: Total Active Cases










Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa for the Week Ending June 12, 2022

- As of Sunday, June 12, 2022, the number of cumulative total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 5,661,460. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the Southern region, stand at 41,503,275 and 194,683 respectively. The region reported 16,922 new cases in the review week, which is a 13.1% decrease compared to the preceding week.
- The total number of deaths reported reached 129,064, of which 196 were new deaths during the week. The total number of recovered cases reached 5,491,155, of which 26,865 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 41,241, indicating a decline of 10,139 cases in the review week, which is mainly attributable to South Africa followed by Madagascar.
- As of June 12, 2022, South Africa accounted for 70.3% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 61.4% of the new cases in the region during the week. The lowest number of total cases in the region, since the start of the pandemic, was recorded in São Tomé & Príncipe at 6,003 of which 98.6% are reported to have recovered.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the Southern region, based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of June 12, 2022, stands at 2.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Malawi at 3.1% and the lowest in Botswana at 0.9%.

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa for the Week Ending June 12, 2022

- As of Sunday, June 12, 2022, the cumulative number of Covid-19 cases in the West Africa region had reached 841,491. The total number of Covid-19 tests conducted and tests per 1 million people, in the West Africa region, stand at 14,973,607 and 37,697 respectively. The region reported 1,242 new cases during the week, which is a 9.2% increase compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week.
- The total number of deaths reported reached 11,019 with 1 new death reported during the review week. The total number of recovered cases since the start of the pandemic is 823,161, of which 769 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 7,311, indicating an increase of 472 cases in the week ending June 12, 2022. The weekly increase in the number of active cases in the region is mainly attributable to Cabo Verde followed by Nigeria.
- Nigeria accounted for 30.5% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Cabo Verde accounted for 43.5% of the new cases in the region during the review week. Liberia recorded the lowest cumulative number of cases in the region since the start of the pandemic, at 7,459.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) based on cumulative total cases and deaths as of June 12, 2022, for the region, stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 3.9% and the lowest in Benin at 0.6%.
