### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa as of May 2, 2021<sup>2</sup>

#### Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending May 2, 2021, almost 141.0 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally bringing the total given since the start of the pandemic to 1,164,205,445. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 23.2% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by the USA at 21.1% and India at 13.5%.
- The number of African countries that have released data on rolling out Covid-19 vaccinations reached 43, though the number of countries that have just started their vaccination roll-out could be higher. As of May 2, 2021, 19,272,017 vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 1.7% of total global vaccinations. Morocco accounts for 48.3% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Nigeria at 6.4%.

#### Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, May 2, 2021, close to 44.5 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa, of which over 0.7 million were reported in the week under review. Ten countries collectively account for 70.3% of the tests conducted in Africa as of May 2, 2021: South Africa (24.0%), Morocco (14.1%), Egypt (6.1%), Ethiopia (5.8%), Nigeria (4.3%), Kenya (3.8%), Zambia (3.2%), Cameroon (3.0%), Tunisia (3.0%) and Rwanda (3.0%).
- The number of average tests per 1 million people in Africa as of May 2, 2021 stands at 33,236, which is an increase of 1.7% over the figure reported in the previous week. Botswana is the best performer on this indicator with 424,830 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (335,977), Gabon (328,480), Mauritius (282,029), Seychelles (218,654), South Africa (180,396) and Eswatini (171,236).

#### Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 152,497,204: the majority of which (29.5%) occurred in Europe, followed by Asia (26.4%), North America (24.7%), South America (16.4%) and Africa (3.0%). To date, 97,144,464 cases have recovered globally, representing 63.7% of confirmed global Covid-19 cases.
- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 5,666,412, indicating a decline of 0.7% compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.

- The number of global deaths due to Coronavirus reached 3,199,015, of which 92,630 were recorded in the week ending May 2, 2021; this shows an increase of 4.4% over the previous week. The number of global active cases increased by 937,045 cases in the review week, to reach 52,153,725 as of May 2, 2021.
- Africa accounted for 3.0% of the total global cases, 3.8% of deaths, 4.2% of recovered cases and 0.7% of active cases as of May 2, 2021, as detailed below.

#### Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of May 2, 2021, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 4,571,597, 77.1% of which were in nine countries, namely South Africa (34.7%), Morocco (11.2%), Tunisia (6.8%), Ethiopia (5.7%), Egypt (5.0%), Libya (3.9%), Nigeria (3.6%), Kenya (3.5%) and Algeria (2.7%). The five countries with the lowest number of cases were Mauritius, Liberia, São Tomé & Príncipe, Eritrea and Guinea-Bissau, with cases ranging between 1,211 in Mauritius and 3,736 in Guinea-Bissau, collectively accounting for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Cabo Verde, South Africa, Tunisia and Libya are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people; rates ranging from 60,546 in Seychelles to 26,246 in Libya. The average cases per million, for Africa, stands at 3,495, much lower than the global average of 19,871.
- In the week under review, a total of 64,853 new cases were reported in Africa, which is a 13.6% decline compared to the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 1.1% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The North Africa region accounted for 39.1% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by Southern Africa (22.8%), East Africa (19.2%), Central Africa (11.8%) and West Africa (7.1%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa decreased by 3,852 cases in the review week to reach 363,952. Currently, just seven countries account for 76.0% of the active cases in Africa, namely Ethiopia (54,150), Kenya (48,798), Egypt (43,824), Tunisia (38,273), Cameroon (35,882), Algeria (33,854) and South Africa (21,869).
- From a regional perspective, North Africa accounts for 36.2% of active cases in Africa, followed by East Africa (33.4%), Central Africa (12.7%), Southern Africa (11.1%) and West Africa (6.6%).

#### Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa


• As of May 2, 2021, a total of 122,297 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 51.4% were in Southern Africa, 32.8% in North Africa, 8.8% in East Africa, 5.0% in West Africa and 2.1% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Egypt, Tunisia, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging from 54,417 in South Africa to 3,726 in Ethiopia. A total of 2,165 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a decline of 3.1% compared to the preceding week.

• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.7%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 2.1%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.6% and East Africa at 1.9%, while North Africa at 2.9% and Southern Africa at 3.1% recorded higher CFRs than the African average. As of May 2, 2021, seventeen African countries, namely Sudan (6.9%), Egypt (5.9%), Somalia (5.1%), Zimbabwe (4.1%), Liberia (4.0%), Comoros (3.8%), Eswatini (3.6%), Niger (3.6%), Chad (3.5%), Tunisia (3.5%), Mali (3.5%), South Africa (3.4%), Malawi (3.4%), The Gambia (3.0%), Lesotho (3.0%), Algeria (2.7%) and Senegal (2.7%) recorded CRFs higher than or equal to the average for Africa.

#### Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of May 2, 2021, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 4,085,348, which is 89.4% of its total confirmed cases. Regionally, the recovery levels stand at 94.9% for Southern Africa, 93.5% for West Africa, 87.5% for North Africa, 76.9% for East Africa, and 68.5% for Central Africa. In the week under review 66,540 newly recovered cases were reported.





Central Africa	

#### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa as of May 2, 2021

- As of Sunday, May 2, 2021, the number of total cases in the Central Africa region reached 154,901. The region reported 7,663 new cases in the review week, which is around twice the number recorded in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 2,528, recording 138 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 106,169, of which 872 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 46,204, which is an increase of 6,653 cases in the review week. This increase in the number of active cases is mainly attributable to Cameroon.
- Cameroon accounted for 46.6% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and for 81.6% of the new cases during the week under review. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the Central region since the onset of the pandemic at 4,828.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region decreased to 1.6% in the review week. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 3.5% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.




# **East Africa**

#### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa as of May 2, 2021

- As of Sunday, May 2, 2021, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 573,493. The region reported 12,422 new cases in the review week, which is a 34.2% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 10,702, recording 401 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 441,227, of which 12,698 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 121,564, which is a decline of 677 cases in the review week. The decline in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Ethiopia.
- Ethiopia accounted for 45.1% of the total cases and 49.1% of the new cases in the Eastern region during the week under review. Eritrea has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 3,671.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 6.9% and the lowest in Burundi at 0.1%.







#### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa as of May 2, 2021


- As of Sunday, May 2, 2021, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 1,372,075. The region reported 25,382 new cases in the review week, which is a 13.7% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 40,129, recording 1,127 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,200,198, of which 26,237 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 131,748 which is a decline of 1,982 cases in the review week. The decline in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Tunisia.
- Morocco accounted for 37.3% of the total cases, while Tunisia accounted for 44.9% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritania has the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 18,448.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region currently stands at 2.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Egypt at 5.9% and the lowest in Libya at 1.7%.






# **Southern Africa**

#### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa as of May 2, 2021

- As of Sunday, May 2, 2021, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 2,011,041. The region reported 14,785 new cases in the review week, which is a 16.7% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 62,867, recording 430 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,907,717, of which 21,731 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 40,457, which is a decline of 7,376 cases in the review week. The decline in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Mozambique, Botswana and Madagascar.
- South Africa accounted for 78.8% of the total cases and 58.1% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritius has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,211.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 3.1%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Zimbabwe at 4.1% and the lowest in Mozambique at 1.2%.



West Africa	

#### Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa as of May 2, 2021

- As of Sunday, May 2, 2021, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 460,087. The region reported 4,601 new cases in the review week, which is a 13.2% decline compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 6,071, recording 69 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 430,037, of which 5,002 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 23,979, which is a decline of 470 cases in the review week. The decline in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Mali, Togo and Guinea.
- Nigeria accounted for 35.9% of the total cases, while Cabo Verde accounted for 43.9% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Liberia has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 2,099.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 4.0% and the lowest in Côte d'Ivoire at 0.6%.
