Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa as of May 16, 2021²

Vaccinations: Status Update

- In the week ending May 16, 2021, over 160.3 million new Covid-19 vaccinations were administered globally, bringing the total given since the start of the pandemic to 1,458,787,389. In terms of the geographical distribution, China accounts for 26.9% of the total number of Covid-19 vaccinations administered to date, followed by the USA at 18.8% and India at 12.5%.
- The number of African countries that have released data on rolling out Covid-19 vaccinations reached 44, though the number of countries that have just started their vaccination roll-out could be higher. As of May 16, 2021, a total of 23,768,410 vaccinations had been administered in Africa, which represents 1.6% of total global vaccinations. Morocco accounts for 44.9% of the vaccinations carried out in Africa to date, followed by Nigeria at 6.0%, Ethiopia (6.0%) and Egypt (5.8%).

Covid-19 Testing in Africa

- As of Sunday, May 16, 2021, close to 46.2 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa, of which over 0.7 million were reported in the week under review. Ten countries collectively account for 70.2% of the tests conducted in Africa as of May 16, 2021: South Africa (24.1%), Morocco (13.8%), Egypt (6.0%), Ethiopia (5.7%), Nigeria (4.3%), Kenya (3.8%), Cameroon (3.3%), Zambia (3.2%), Tunisia (3.0%) and Rwanda (3.0%).
- The number of average tests per 1 million people in Africa as of May 16, 2021 stands at 34,471, which is an increase of 1.4% over the figure reported in the previous week. Botswana is the best performer on this indicator with 463,250 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (370,899), Gabon (344,805), Mauritius (282,029), Seychelles (218,654), South Africa (187,410) and Eswatini (175,938).

Confirmed, New and Active Global Covid-19 Cases

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases since the start of the pandemic reached 162,778,871: the majority of which (28.6%) occurred in Asia, followed by Europe (28.2%), North America (23.9%), South America (16.4%) and Africa (2.9%). To date, 106,530,975 cases have recovered globally, representing 65.4% of confirmed global Covid-19 cases.
- The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 4,824,779, indicating a decline of 11.6% compared to the new cases recorded in the preceding week.

- The number of global deaths due to Covid-19 reached 3,374,776, of which 85,963 were recorded in the week ending May 16, 2021; this shows decline of 4.3% over the previous week. The number of global active cases increased by 54,684 cases in the review week, to reach 52,873,120 as of May 16, 2021.
- Africa accounted for 2.9% of the total global cases, 3.7% of deaths, 3.9% of recovered cases and 0.7% of active cases as of May 16, 2021, as detailed below.

Confirmed, New and Active Covid-19 Cases in Africa

- As of May 16, 2021, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 4,688,159, 76.9% of which were in nine countries, namely South Africa (34.4%), Morocco (11.0%), Tunisia (7.0%), Ethiopia (5.7%), Egypt (5.2%), Libya (3.9%), Nigeria (3.5%), Kenya (3.5%) and Algeria (2.7%). The five countries with the lowest number of cases were Mauritius, Liberia, São Tomé & Príncipe, Guinea-Bissau and Eritrea, with cases ranging between 1,282 in Mauritius and 3,844 in Eritrea, collectively accounting for 0.3% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Seychelles, Cabo Verde, Tunisia, South Africa and Libya are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people; rates ranging from 94,680 in Seychelles to 26,734 in Libya. The average cases per million for Africa stands at 3,567, which is much lower than the global average of 21,001.
- In the week under review, a total of 55,653 new cases were reported in Africa, which is an 8.6% decline compared to the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 1.2% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The Southern Africa region accounted for 42.1% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by North Africa (32.3%), East Africa (18.1%), West Africa (5.7%) and Central Africa (1.8%).
- The total number of active cases in Africa increased by 164 cases in the review week to reach 359,603. Currently, just seven countries collectively account for 76.7% of the active cases in Africa, namely Egypt (49,916), Kenya (48,850), Ethiopia (42,702), Cameroon (38,533), Algeria (34,578), South Africa (34,166) and Tunisia (27,079).
- From a regional perspective, North Africa accounts for 34.7% of active cases in Africa, followed by East Africa (31.1%), Southern Africa (14.3%), Central Africa (13.9%) and West Africa (6.0%).

Deaths and the Case Fatality Rates in Africa


• As of May 16, 2021, a total of 126,311 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.6% were in Southern Africa, 33.4% in North Africa, 9.0% in East Africa, 4.9% in West Africa and 2.1% in Central Africa. The five countries with the highest number of reported deaths due to Covid-19 since the start of the pandemic are South Africa, Egypt, Tunisia, Morocco and Ethiopia, ranging from 55,210 in South Africa to 3,996 in Ethiopia. A total of 1,917 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a decline of 8.6% compared to the preceding week.

• The case fatality rate (CFR), i.e. deaths per confirmed cases for Africa, stands at 2.7%, which is higher than the global CFR rate of 2.1%. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by Central Africa at 1.6%, East Africa at 1.9%, North Africa at 3.0% and Southern Africa at 3.1%. As of May 16, 2021, seventeen African countries recorded CFRs higher than the African average with Sudan the highest at 7.0%., followed by Egypt (5.8%), Somalia (5.2%), Zimbabwe (4.1%), Liberia (4.0%), Comoros (3.8%), Eswatini (3.6%), Niger (3.6%), Tunisia (3.6%), Mali (3.6%), Chad (3.5%), South Africa (3.4%), Malawi (3.4%), Lesotho (3.0%), The Gambia (2.9%), Senegal (2.8%) and Algeria (2.7%).

Recovery Rates in Africa

• As of May 16, 2021, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 4,202,245, which represents 89.6% of its total confirmed cases. Regionally, the recovery levels stand at 94.4% for Southern Africa, 94.1% for West Africa, 88.2% for North Africa, 79.3% for East Africa, and 67.2% for Central Africa. In the week under review 53,572 newly recovered cases were reported.


Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa as of May 16, 2021


- As of Sunday, May 16, 2021, the number of reported total cases in the Central Africa region reached 160,114. The region reported 1,021 new cases in the review week, which is lower by 75.6% compared to the number recorded in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 2,599, recording 8 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 107,530, of which 0.6% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 49,985, which is an increase of 370 cases in the review week.
- Cameroon accounted for 46.8% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Gabon accounted for 35.9% of the new cases during the week under review. Chad has recorded the lowest number of total cases in the Central region since the onset of the pandemic at 4,904.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.6%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 3.5% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.

East Africa


Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa as of May 16, 2021

- As of Sunday, May 16, 2021, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 593,839. The region reported 10,073 new cases in the review week, which is a 1.9% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 11,372, recording 316 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 470,637, of which 3.2% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 111,830, which is a decline of 5,274 cases in the review week. The decline in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Ethiopia.
- Ethiopia accounted for 44.8% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 35.4% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Eritrea has reported the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 3,844.1

The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 7.0% and the lowest in Burundi at 0.1%.







Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa as of May 16, 2021


- As of Sunday, May 16, 2021, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 1,412,786. The region reported 17,958 new cases in the review week, which is a 21.1% decline compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 42,193, recording 934 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,245,880, of which 1.6% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 124,713 which is a decline of 3,023 cases in the review week. The decline in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Morocco and Tunisia.
- Morocco accounted for 36.4% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Egypt accounted for 46.3% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritania has the lowest number of total cases in the region since the start of the pandemic at 18,828.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region currently stands at 3.0%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Egypt at 5.8% and the lowest in Libya at 1.7%.






Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa as of May 16, 2021

- As of Sunday, May 16, 2021, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 2,053,951. The region reported 23,406 new cases in the review week, which is a 20% increase compared to the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 63,976, recording 612 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,938,492, of which 0.7% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 51,483, which is an increase of 8,853 cases in the review week. The increase in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to South Africa.
- South Africa accounted for 78.6% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic and 73.2% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritius has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,282.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 3.1%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Zimbabwe at 4.1% and the lowest in Mozambique at 1.2%.



West Africa	

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa as of May 16, 2021

- As of Sunday, May 16, 2021, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 467,469. The region reported 3,195 new cases in the review week, which is a 23.7% decline compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 6,171, recording 47 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 439,706, of which 0.9% were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 21,592, which is a decline of 762 cases in the review week. The decline in the number of active cases in the region during the review week is mainly attributable to Ghana, Cabo Verde and Mali.
- Nigeria accounted for 35.4% of the total cases reported in the region since the start of the pandemic, while Cabo Verde accounted for 54.1% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Liberia has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 2,114.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 4.0% and the lowest in Côte d'Ivoire at 0.6%.
