Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa as of September 27, 2020²


- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases reached 32,994,213 as of September 27, 2020, the majority of which (30.9%) were in Asia, followed by North America (25.7%), South America (23.9%) and Europe (15.0%). The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 2,065,050. To date, 22,866,271 cases have recovered, representing 69.3% of confirmed Covid-19 cases. The number of global deaths reached 996,682, of which 37,154 were recorded in the past week. The number of global active cases stands at 9,131,260.
- Africa accounted for 4.4% of the total global cases, 3.5% of deaths, 5.3% of recovered cases and 2.4% of active cases as of September 27, 2020. In Africa, the number of active cases has been falling over the past seven weeks as a result of a higher number of recoveries compared to the number of newly recorded cases.
- As of Sunday September 27, 2020, almost 14.9 million people had been tested for Covid-19 in Africa, of which over 0.6 million tests were conducted in the week under review. The majority (27.8%) of these tests were conducted in South Africa, followed by Morocco (17.1%), Ethiopia (8.4%), Egypt (4.2%), Kenya (3.6%), Nigeria (3.4%) and Rwanda (3.3%), which collectively accounted for 67.8% of the tests conducted in Africa.
- Considering tests in relation to population size, Mauritius leads with 193,688 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (142,012), Djibouti (77,000), Botswana (76,433), Gabon (73,353), South Africa (69,863) and Morocco (69,177). The average tests per 1 million people in Africa, stands at 11,125, which is an increase of 4.4% over the past week.
- Tests per case in Africa stand at 10.2 as of September 27, 2020, indicating that there is one confirmed case for every 10 tests conducted, compared to 19.3 global average. Regionally, the values for tests per case were 19.7 for East Africa, 14.8 for Central Africa, 11.7 for North Africa, 11.2 for West Africa and 7.0 for Southern Africa.
- As of September 27, 2020, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 1,460,319. More than half of these cases (51.4%) were reported in Southern Africa, followed by North Africa at 22.4%, West Africa at 12.0% and East Africa at 10.3%. Central Africa is the least affected region, with 3.8% of the total cases in Africa. Southern Africa was the region with the highest number of cases, with 89.4% of those cases reported in the nation of South Africa; the remaining countries of the region being among the least affected.
- South Africa, Morocco, Egypt, Ethiopia, Nigeria, Algeria, Ghana, Kenya and Libya together account for 81.5% of the cases in Africa, as of September 27, 2020. Five countries with the least number of cases are the Seychelles, Mauritius, Eritrea, Comoros and Burundi; cases ranging between 143 in Seychelles and 485 in Burundi. Considering population size, South Africa, Cabo Verde, Djibouti, Libya and Eswatini are the five countries with the highest number

of confirmed cases per million people; rates ranging from 11,455 in South Africa to 4,331 in Eswatini.

- In the week under review, a total of 52,652 new cases were reported in Africa, which is a 3.0% decline compared to the new cases recorded in the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 2.5% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The North Africa region accounted for 53.0% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by Southern Africa (26.0%), East Africa (13.8%), West Africa (6.1%), and Central Africa (1.0%).
- As of September 27, 2020, a total of 35,163 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 50.9% were in Southern Africa, 30.0% in North Africa, 8.6% in East Africa, 7.4% in West Africa and 3.0% in Central Africa. South Africa, Egypt, Morocco, Algeria, Ethiopia and Nigeria are the six countries with the highest reported deaths due to Covid-19. A total of 1,207 new deaths were reported in the week under review, which is a decline of 9.5% compared to the preceding week. As of September 27, 2020, Eritrea and the Seychelles are the only countries in Africa not to have reported any deaths since the onset of the pandemic.
- The case fatality rate (CFR), deaths per confirmed cases, for Africa stands at 2.4% in the review period, which is lower than the global average of 3.0%. However, the CFR in Africa has increased since August 2020, compared with its level of 2.1% in July 2020, mainly reflecting the trend in the Southern Africa region, while the global average CFR is on a continuous decline. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.5%, followed by Central Africa at 1.9%, East Africa at 2.0% and Southern Africa at 2.4%, while North Africa at 3.2% recorded higher CFR than the African average. Higher than or equal to the global average CFRs have been recorded in eleven African countries, namely Chad (7.1%), Sudan (6.1%), Liberia (6.1%), Niger (5.8%), Egypt (5.7%), Mali (4.2%), Angola (3.7%), Algeria (3.4%), Sierra Leone (3.3%), Gambia (3.1%) and Malawi (3.1%)
- As of September 27, 2020, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 1,207,254, which is 82.7% of its total confirmed cases. West Africa (89.1%), Southern Africa (88.7%) and Central Africa (87.2%) have recorded higher recovery rates than the average for Africa, while North Africa (78.4%) and East Africa (52.7%) showed relatively lower recovery rates. In the week under review, 53,903 newly recovered cases were reported.
- As of September 27, 2020, the total number of active cases in Africa stands at 217,902, which is a reduction of 2,458 cases over the previous week. Africa has continued to see a reduction in active cases in the past seven consecutive weeks, as the numbers of recovered cases remain higher than the number of newly recorded cases within the period. In the week under review, active cases declined in all regions except North Africa and East Africa. Three countries, namely South Africa, Ethiopia and Morocco accounted for 51.6% of the active cases as of September 27, 2020.



Central Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa as of September 27, 2020


- As of Sunday, September 27, 2020, the number of total cases in the Central Africa region reached 56,095. The region reported 528 new cases in the review week, which is a 13.4% decline compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 1,061, recording 6 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 48,939, of which 844 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 6,095, which is a decline of 322 cases in the review week.
- Cameroon accounted for 37.0% of the total cases and 57.6% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Chad has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,178.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 7.1% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.



Equatorial Guinea: Total Active Cases



East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa as of September 27, 2020

- As of Sunday, September 27, 2020, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 151,076. The region reported 7,278 new cases in the review week, which is a 2.0% increase compared to the number of new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 3,037, recording 131 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 79,664, of which 4,088 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 68,375, which is an increase of 3,059 cases in the review week.
- Ethiopia accounted for 48.5% of the total cases and 62.0% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Seychelles has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 143.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.0%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 6.1% and the lowest in Eritrea and Seychelles, where no deaths have been reported to date.



North Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa as of September 27, 2020

- As of Sunday, September 27, 2020, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 327,534. The region reported 27,901 new cases in the review week, which is 3.4% higher compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 10,561, recording 525 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 256,761, of which 27,045 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 60,212, which is an increase of 331 cases in the review week.
- Morocco accounted for 35.9% of the total cases and 57.1% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritania has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 7,464.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 3.2%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Egypt at 5.7% and the lowest in Tunisia at 1.3%.





Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa as of September 27, 2020


- As of Sunday, September 27, 2020, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 750,194. The region reported 13,712 new cases in the review week, which is 14.1% lower compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 17,901, recording 509 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 665,574, of which 17,210 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 66,719, which is a decline of 4,007 cases in the review week.
- South Africa accounted for 89.4% of the total cases and 69.7% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritius had the lowest number of total cases in the region at 367.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.4%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Angola at 3.7% and the lowest in Botswana at 0.5%.







West Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa as of September 27, 2020

- As of Sunday, September 27, 2020, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 175,420. The region reported 3,233 new cases in the review week, which is 9.9% lower compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 2,603, recording 36 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 156,316, of which 4,716 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 16,501, which is a decline of 1,519 cases in the review week.
- Nigeria accounted for 33.2% of the total cases and 33.5% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Niger has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,196.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.5%. The highest CFRs in the region are reported in Liberia at 6.1% and the lowest in Guinea, Ghana, and Côte d'Ivoire at 0.6%.
