
Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa as of January 17, 2021²

- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases reached 95,037,620 as of January 17, 2021, the majority of which (29.1%) were in Europe, followed by North America (28.8%), Asia (23.3%) and South America (15.4%). The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 4,777,142. To date, 60,152,816 cases have recovered, representing 63.3% of confirmed global Covid-19 cases. The number of global deaths reached 2,030,669, of which 95,884 were recorded in the past week. The number of global active cases stands at 32,854,135.
- Africa accounted for 3.4% of the total global cases, 3.9% of deaths, 4.5% of recovered cases and 1.5% of active cases as of January 17, 2021.
- As of Sunday, January 17, 2021, more than 29.4 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa, of which over 1.9 million were reported in the week under review. The majority (25.9%) of these tests were conducted in South Africa, followed by Morocco (17.6%), Ethiopia (6.4%), Nigeria (3.9%), Kenya (3.8%), Egypt (3.4%), Rwanda (2.7%), Uganda (2.7%), Cameroon (2.7%), Zambia (2.6%) and Tunisia (2.6%), which collectively accounted for 74.2% of the tests conducted in Africa.
- Considering tests in relation to population size, Botswana leads with 248,411 tests per 1 million people, followed by Mauritius (236,950), Seychelles (218,654), Cabo Verde (195,776), Gabon (182,337), Morocco (140,495), South Africa (128,370) and Djibouti (105,824). The average tests per 1 million people in Africa stands at 21,995, which is an increase of 6.8% over the past week.
- As of January 17, 2021, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 3,262,232. The majority of these cases (47.4%) were reported in Southern Africa, followed by North Africa at 31.4%, East Africa at 10.0%, West Africa at 8.7% and Central Africa at 2.4%. Southern Africa accounted for the highest number of cases, with 86.4% of those cases reported in the nation of South Africa. On the other hand, the rest of Southern African countries are among the least affected in Africa collectively accounting for 6.4% of the confirmed cases in Africa.
- South Africa (41.0%), Morocco (14.1%), Tunisia (5.5%), Egypt (4.8%), Ethiopia (4.0%), Nigeria (3.4%), Libya (3.3%), Algeria (3.2%) and Kenya (3.0%) together account for 82.3% of the total cases in Africa, as of January 17, 2021. The five countries with the lowest number of cases are Mauritius, Seychelles, São Tomé & Príncipe, Burundi and Comoros; cases range between 547 in Mauritius and 1,592 in Comoros, thus collectively accounting for 0.2% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Cabo Verde, South Africa, Libya, Tunisia and Morocco are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people; rates ranging from 23,624 in Cabo Verde to 12,603 in Morocco.

- In the week under review, a total of 210,651 new cases were reported in Africa, which is a 4.8% decline compared to the new cases recorded in the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 4.4% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The Southern Africa region accounted for 65.0% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by North Africa (19.5%), West Africa (8.9%), East Africa (4.8%) and Central Africa (1.8%).
- As of January 17, 2021, a total of 78,907 deaths have been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 51.3% were in Southern Africa, 34.4% in North Africa, 7.8% in East Africa, 4.6% in West Africa and 1.9% in Central Africa. South Africa, Egypt, Morocco, Tunisia and Algeria are the five countries with the highest reported deaths due to Covid-19, with deaths ranging from 37,105 in South Africa to 2,836 in Algeria. A total of 6,200 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is an increase of 13.5% compared to the preceding week.
- The case fatality rate (CFR), deaths per confirmed cases for Africa stands at 2.4% in the review period, higher than the global average of 2.1%. The CFR in Africa has stayed unchanged at 2.4% since August 2020, while the global average CFR has been on a continuous decline. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.3%, followed by East Africa and Central Africa at 1.9%, while North Africa and Southern Africa at 2.6% recorded higher CFR than the African average. As of January 17, 2021, higher than Africa average CFRs were recorded in 18 African countries, namely Sudan (6.1%), Egypt (5.5%), Liberia (4.5%), Mali (4.0%), Chad (3.8%), Niger (3.4%), Tunisia (3.2%), The Gambia (3.2%), DRC (3.0%), Eswatini (2.9%), South Africa (2.8%), Comoros (2.8%), Somalia (2.7%), Algeria (2.7%), Sierra Leone (2.6%), Zimbabwe (2.6%), Malawi (2.5%) and Mauritania (2.5%).
- As of January 17, 2021, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 2,676,857, which is 82.1% of its total confirmed cases. Central Africa (87.0%), West Africa (86.7%) and North Africa (83.7%) have recorded higher recovery rates than the average for Africa, while Southern Africa (80.9%) and East Africa (77.3%) showed relatively lower recovery rates. In the week under review, 210,289 newly recovered cases were reported.
- As of January 17, 2021, the total number of active cases in Africa stands at 506,468, which is a decline of 5,838 cases over the previous week. Six countries, namely South Africa (202,380), Tunisia (45,406), Algeria (30,443), Egypt (24,821), Uganda (24,698), Libya (21,298) and Nigeria (19,635) jointly accounted for 72.8% of the active cases as of January 17, 2021.
- From a regional perspective, Southern Africa accounts for 50.5% of active cases in Africa, North Africa (27.6%), East Africa (13.4%), West Africa (6.7%) and Central Africa (1.7%). Southern and North Africa jointly account for about 78.1% of all active cases in Africa.




Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa as of January 17, 2021


- As of Sunday, January 17, 2021, the number of total cases in the Central Africa region reached 79,750. The region reported 3,846 new cases in the review week, which is more than double the number of new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 1,526, recording 37 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 69,376, of which 2,393 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 8,848, which is an increase of 1,416 cases in the review week.
- Cameroon accounted for 35.1% of the total cases, while DRC accounted for 38.3% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Chad has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 2,895.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 3.8% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.7%.
















Equatorial Guinea: Total Active Cases



East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa as of January 17, 2021

- As of Sunday, January 17, 2021, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 326,014. The region reported 10,090 new cases in the review week, which is a 30.8% increase compared to the number of new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 6,140, recording 249 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 251,943, of which 8,990 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 67,931, which is an increase of 851 cases in the review week.
- Ethiopia accounted for 40.2% of the total cases, while Sudan accounted for 29.4% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Seychelles has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 705.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 6.1% and the lowest in Burundi at 0.2%.





North Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa as of January 17, 2021

- As of Sunday, January 17, 2021, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 1,025,118. The region reported 41,117 new cases in the review week, which is a 6.8% increase compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 27,120, recording 1,193 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 858,093, of which 33,657 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 139,905, which is an increase of 6,267 cases in the review week.
- Morocco accounted for 44.8% of the total cases, while Tunisia accounted for 50.6% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritania has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 16,039.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.6%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Egypt at 5.5% and the lowest in Libya at 1.5%.

Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa as of January 17, 2021

- As of Sunday, January 17, 2021, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 1,547,663. The region reported 136,867 new cases in the review week, which is a 12.8% decline compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 40,480, recording 4,532 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,251,527, of which 149,330 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 255,656, which is a decline of 16,995 cases in the review week.
- South Africa accounted for 86.4% of the total cases and 77.7% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritius has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 547.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.6%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Eswatini at 2.9% and the lowest in Botswana at 0.4%.




















West Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa as of January 17, 2021

- As of Sunday, January 17, 2021, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 283,687. The region reported 18,731 new cases in the review week, which is a 15.4% increase compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 3,641, recording 189 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 245,918, of which 15,919 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 34,128, which is an increase of 2,623 cases in the review week.
- Nigeria accounted for 38.9% of the total cases and 55.0% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Liberia has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,887.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 4.5% and the lowest in Côte d'Ivoire, Guinea, and Ghana at 0.6%.
