Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa as of January 31, 2021²


- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases reached 102,951,340 as of January 31, 2021, the majority of which (29.5%) were in Europe, followed by North America (29.1%), Asia (22.5%) and South America (15.4%). The number of new cases reported globally in the review week amounted to 3,772,827. To date, 64,890,971 cases have recovered, representing 63.0% of confirmed global Covid-19 cases. The number of global deaths reached 2,227,765, of which 98,626 were recorded in the past week. The number of global active cases stands at 35,832,604.
- Africa accounted for 3.5% of the total global cases, 4.1% of deaths, 4.7% of recovered cases and 1.2% of active cases as of January 31, 2021.
- As of Sunday, January 31, 2021, more than 31.5 million tests for Covid-19 had been administered in Africa, of which over 0.9 million were reported in the week under review. The majority (26.2%) of these tests were conducted in South Africa, followed by Morocco (17.0%), Ethiopia (6.2%), Nigeria (4.1%), Kenya (3.8%), Egypt (3.2%), Zambia (2.9%), Rwanda (2.8%), Tunisia (2.7%) and Uganda (2.6%), which collectively accounted for 71.5% of the tests conducted in Africa.
- Considering tests in relation to population size, Botswana leads with 275,824 tests per 1 million people, followed by Mauritius (236,950), Seychelles (218,654), Cabo Verde (200,346), Gabon (197,292), Morocco (145,649), South Africa (139,595) and Eswatini (112,906). The number of average tests per 1 million people in Africa stands at 23,600, which is an increase of 3.2% over the past week.
- As of January 31, 2021, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 3,568,667. The majority of these cases (48.3%) were reported in Southern Africa, followed by North Africa at 30.5%, East Africa at 9.7%, West Africa at 9.1% and Central Africa at 2.4%. Southern Africa accounted for the highest number of cases, with 84.4% of those cases reported in the nation of South Africa. On the other hand, the rest of Southern African countries are among the least affected in Africa collectively accounting for 7.6% of the confirmed cases in Africa.
- South Africa (40.7%), Morocco (13.2%), Tunisia (5.9%), Egypt (4.7%), Ethiopia (3.9%), Nigeria (3.7%), Libya (3.3%), Algeria (3.0%) and Kenya (2.8%) together account for 81.1% of the total cases in Africa, as of January 31, 2021. The five countries with the lowest number of cases are Mauritius, Seychelles, São Tomé & Príncipe, Burundi and Liberia; cases range between 569 in Mauritius and 1,939 in Liberia, thus collectively accounting for 0.2% of the confirmed cases in Africa. Considering population size, Cabo Verde, South Africa, Tunisia, Libya and Eswatini are the five countries with the highest number of confirmed cases per million people; rates ranging from 25,582 in Cabo Verde to 13,686 in Eswatini.

- In the week under review, a total of 131,029 new cases were reported in Africa, which is a 25.3% decline compared to the new cases recorded in the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 3.5% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The Southern Africa region accounted for 51.7% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by North Africa (20.9%), West Africa (17.0%), East Africa (8.9%) and Central Africa (1.4%).
- As of January 31, 2021, a total of 90,967 deaths have been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 54.1% were in Southern Africa, 32.5% in North Africa, 7.2% in East Africa, 4.5% in West Africa and 1.7% in Central Africa. South Africa, Egypt, Morocco, Tunisia and Algeria are the five countries with the highest reported deaths due to Covid-19, with deaths ranging from 44,164 in South Africa to 2,891 in Algeria. A total of 5,783 new deaths were reported in Africa in the week under review, which is a decline of 7.9% compared to the preceding week.
- The case fatality rate (CFR), deaths per confirmed cases for Africa stands at 2.5% in the review period, higher than the global average of 2.2%. Following increases in number of deaths in recent weeks, the CFR for Africa has increased to 2.5% in January 2021, after staying unchanged at 2.4 percent in the preceding five months. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.2%, followed by East Africa and Central Africa at 1.9%, while North Africa at 2.7% and Southern Africa at 2.9% recorded higher CFR than the African average. As of January 31, 2021, higher than or equal to Africa average CFRs were recorded in 17 African countries, namely Sudan (6.2%), Egypt (5.6%), Liberia (4.3%), Mali (4.1%), Eswatini (3.6%), Zimbabwe (3.6%), Chad (3.5%), Niger (3.5%), Comoros (3.4%), Tunisia (3.2%), The Gambia (3.1%), South Africa (3.0%), DRC (2.9%), Malawi (2.9%), Somalia (2.7%), Algeria (2.7%) and Mauritania (2.5%).
- As of January 31, 2021, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 3,051,738, which is 85.5% of its total confirmed cases. Regionally, the recovery rates were 87.4% for Southern Africa, 85.3% for West Africa, 84.9% for North Africa, 84.6% for Central Africa and 78.4% for East Africa. In the week under review, 159,331 newly recovered cases were reported.
- As of January 31, 2021, the total number of active cases in Africa stands at 425,962, which is a decline of 34,085 cases over the previous week. Six countries, namely South Africa (109,977), Tunisia (44,685), Algeria (31,104), Egypt (26,999), Uganda (25,076) and Nigeria (24,667) jointly accounted for 61.6% of the active cases as of January 31, 2021.
- From a regional perspective, Southern Africa accounts for 39.3% of active cases in Africa, North Africa (31.7%), East Africa (16.0%), West Africa (10.3%) and Central Africa (2.7%). Southern and North Africa jointly account for about 71.0% of all active cases in Africa.




Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa as of January 31, 2021


- As of Sunday, January 31, 2021, the number of total cases in the Central Africa region reached 84,896. The region reported 1,796 new cases in the review week, which is a 46.4% decline compared to the number of new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 1,585, recording 13 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 71,817, of which 782 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 11,494, which is an increase of 1,001 cases in the review week.
- Cameroon accounted for 34.9% of the total cases, while DRC accounted for 50.2% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Chad has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 3,376.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 3.5% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.



Congo Rep. of: Total Active Cases

















East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa as of January 31, 2021

- As of Sunday, January 31, 2021, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 345,538. The region reported 11,702 new cases in the review week, which is a 49.6% increase compared to the number of new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 6,567, recording 305 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 270,865, of which 13,185 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 68,106, which is a decline of 1,788 cases in the review week.
- Ethiopia accounted for 39.8% of the total cases and 33.2% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Seychelles has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,205.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 6.2% and the lowest in Burundi at 0.1%.


North Africa


Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa as of January 31, 2021

- As of Sunday, January 31, 2021, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 1,088,598. The region reported 27,438 new cases in the review week, which is a 23.9% decline compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 29,535, recording 1,150 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 923,968, of which 30,957 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 135,095, which is a decline of 4,669 cases in the review week.
- Morocco accounted for 43.3% of the total cases, while Tunisia accounted for 42.0% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritania has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 16,635.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.7%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Egypt at 5.6% and the lowest in Libya at 1.6%.



Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa as of January 31, 2021

- As of Sunday, January 31, 2021, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 1,723,333. The region reported 67,772 new cases in the review week, which is a 37.2% decline compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 49,206, recording 4,084 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 1,506,631, of which 96,592 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 167,496, which is a decline of 32,904 cases in the review week.
- South Africa accounted for 84.4% of the total cases and 60.2% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritius has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 569.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.9%. The highest CFRs in the region were reported in Eswatini and Zimbabwe at 3.6% and the lowest in Botswana at 0.6%.
















West Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa as of January 31, 2021

- As of Sunday, January 31, 2021, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 326,302. The region reported 22,321 new cases in the review week, which is a 10.0% increase compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 4,074, recording 231 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 278,457, of which 17,815 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 43,771, which is an increase of 4,275 cases in the review week.
- Nigeria accounted for 40.2% of the total cases and 43.3% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Liberia has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,939.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.2%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Liberia at 4.3% and the lowest in Côte d'Ivoire at 0.5%.
