Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Africa as of September 13, 2020²


- Globally, the total number of confirmed Covid-19 cases reached 28,902,170 as of September 13, 2020, the majority of which (51.3%) were in the Americas, followed by Asia (29.4%) and Europe (14.5%). The number of new cases reported globally, in the review week, amounted to 1,897,785. To date, 19,562,921 cases have recovered, representing 67.7% of confirmed Covid-19 cases. The number of global deaths reached 922,735 of which 40,673 were recorded in the past week. The number of global active cases stands at 8,416,514.
- Africa accounted for 4.7% of the total global cases, 3.5% of deaths, 5.6% of recovered cases and 2.6% of active cases, as of September 13, 2020. In Africa, the number of active cases has been falling over the past five weeks, as a result of higher recoveries compared to newly recorded cases.
- As of Sunday September 13, 2020, more than 13.1 million people had been tested for Covid-19 in Africa, of which over 0.6 million tests were conducted in the week under review. The majority (29.8%) of these tests were conducted in South Africa followed by Morocco (16.9%), Ethiopia (8.6%), Kenya (3.7%), Egypt (3.6%) and Ghana (3.4%), which collectively accounted for 66.0% of the tests conducted in Africa.
- Considering tests in relation to population size, Mauritius leads with 178,813 tests per 1 million people, followed by Cabo Verde (137,730), Djibouti (72,629), South Africa (66,069), Gabon (60,930), Morocco (60,418) and Botswana (58,806). The average tests per 1 million people in Africa, stands at 9,837, which is an increase of 4.9% over the past week.
- Tests per case in Africa stand at 9.7 as of September 13, 2020, indicating that there is one confirmed case for every 10 tests conducted, compared to 19.7 for the world. Regionally, the values for tests per case were 19.8 for East Africa, 11.9 for North Africa, 10.3 for Central Africa and West Africa, and 6.8 for Southern Africa.
- As of September 13, 2020, the total number of confirmed cases in Africa reached 1,353,380. The majority of these cases (53.2%) were reported in Southern Africa, followed by North Africa at 20.1%, West Africa at 12.5% and East Africa at 10.1%. Central Africa is the relatively less affected region with 4.1% of the total cases in Africa. Southern Africa was the region with the highest number of cases, with 90.2% of those cases reported in the nation of South Africa; the remaining countries of the region are among the least affected.
- South Africa, Egypt, Morocco, Ethiopia, Nigeria, Algeria, Ghana and Kenya together account for 80.4% of the cases in Africa, as of September 13, 2020. Five countries with the least number of cases are the Seychelles, Mauritius, Eritrea, Comoros and Burundi, which collectively account for less than 0.2% of the cases in Africa. Considering population size, South Africa, Cabo Verde, Djibouti, Eswatini and São Tomé and Príncipe are the five countries with

the highest number of confirmed cases per million people; rates ranging from 11,097 in South Africa to 4,214 in São Tomé and Príncipe.

- In the week under review, a total of 53,734 new cases were reported in Africa, which is 0.9% lower compared to the previous week. These new cases in Africa account for 2.8% of the weekly new cases recorded globally. The North Africa region accounted for 44.8% of the weekly new cases in Africa, followed by Southern Africa (30.0%), East Africa (15.3%), West Africa (7.7%), and Central Africa (2.2%).
- As of September 13, 2020, a total of 32,622 deaths had been reported in Africa since the start of the pandemic, of which 51.5% were in Southern Africa, 29.0% in North Africa, 8.5% in East Africa, 7.7% in West Africa and 3.2% in Central Africa. South Africa, Egypt, Algeria, Morocco and Nigeria are the five countries with the highest reported deaths due to Covid-19. A total of 1,338 new deaths were reported in the week under review, which is a decline of 21.2% compared to the preceding week. As of September 13, 2020, Eritrea and the Seychelles are the only countries in Africa not to have reported any deaths since the onset of the pandemic.
- The case fatality rate (CFR), deaths per confirmed cases, for Africa stands at 2.4% in the review period, which is lower than the global average of 3.2%. However, CFR in Africa showed an increase in August, compared with its level of 2.1% in July 2020, mainly reflecting the trend in the Southern Africa region, while the global average CFR is on a continuous decline. Regionally, West Africa has the lowest CFR at 1.5%, followed by Central Africa at 1.9%, East Africa at 2.0% and Southern Africa at 2.3%, while North Africa at 3.5% recorded higher CFR than the African average. Higher than the global average CFRs have been recorded in ten African countries, namely Chad (7.4%), Liberia (6.2%), Sudan (6.2%), Niger (5.8%), Egypt (5.6%), Mali (4.4%), Angola (4.0%), Sierra Leone (3.4%), Burkina Faso (3.3%) and Algeria (3.3%)
- As of September 13, 2020, the number of recovered cases in Africa reached 1,099,758, which is 81.3% of its total confirmed cases. Southern Africa (at 87.6%), Central Africa (86.3%) and West Africa (85.3%) have recorded higher recovery rates than the average for Africa, while North Africa (at 75.8%) and East Africa (51.6%) showed relatively lower recovery rates. In the week under review, 63,589 newly recovered cases were reported.
- As of September 13, 2020, the total number of active cases in Africa stands at 221,000, which is a reduction of 11,193 cases over the previous week. Africa has continued to see a reduction in active cases in the past five consecutive weeks, as the numbers of recovered cases remain higher than the number of newly recorded cases within the period. In the week under review, active cases declined in all the regions except East Africa.



Central Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Central Africa as of September 13, 2020

- As of Sunday, September 13, 2020, the number of total cases in the Central Africa region reached 54,957. The region reported 1,174 new cases in the review week, which is a 19.5% decline compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 1,045, recording 10 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 47,439, of which 3,237 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 6,473 which is a decline of 2,073 cases in the review week.
- Cameroon accounted for 36.7% of the total cases and 48.0% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Chad has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,084.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.9%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Chad at 7.4% and the lowest in Gabon at 0.6%.

East Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in East Africa as of September 13, 2020

- As of Sunday, September 13, 2020, the number of total cases in the East Africa region reached 136,663. The region reported 8,227 new cases in the review week, which is 18.3% lower compared to the number of new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 2,784, recording 141 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 70,454, of which 6,703 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 63,425, which is an increase of 1,383 cases in the review week.
- Ethiopia accounted for 47.1% of the total cases and 68.4% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Seychelles has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 139.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.0%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Sudan at 6.2% and the lowest in Eritrea and Seychelles, where no deaths have been reported to date.




North Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in North Africa as of September 13, 2020


- As of Sunday, September 13, 2020, the number of total cases in the North Africa region reached 272,641. The region reported 24,088 new cases in the review week, which is 19.5% higher compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 9,468, recording 483 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 206,725, of which 30,096 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 56,448 which is a decline of 6,491 cases in the review week.
- Egypt accounted for 37.0% of the total cases, while Morocco accounted for 59.3% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Tunisia has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 6,635.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 3.5%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Egypt at 5.6% and the lowest in Libya and Tunisia at 1.6%.












Southern Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in Southern Africa as of September 13, 2020


- As of Sunday, September 13, 2020, the number of total cases in the Southern Africa region reached 720,520. The region reported 16,106 new cases in the review week, which is 11.5% lower compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 16,807, recording 651 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 631,251, of which 18,886 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 72,462, which is a decline of 3,431 cases in the review week.
- South Africa accounted for 90.2% of the total cases and 70.0% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Mauritius has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 361.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 2.3%. The highest CFR in the region was reported in Angola at 4.0% and the lowest in Botswana at 0.4%.




Botswana: Total Active Cases












Eswatini: Total Active Cases





West Africa

Highlights of the Covid-19 Situation in West Africa as of September 13, 2020

- As of Sunday, September 13, 2020, the number of total cases in the West Africa region reached 168,599. The region reported 4,139 new cases in the review week, which is 4.3% lower compared to the new cases reported in the preceding week. The total number of deaths reported reached 2,518, recording 53 new deaths in the review week. The number of total recovered cases reached 143,889, of which 4,667 were newly recovered cases during the review week. The total number of active cases stands at 22,192, which is a decline of 581 cases in the review week.
- Nigeria accounted for 33.4% of the total cases and 30.2% of the new cases in the region during the week under review. Niger has the lowest number of total cases in the region at 1,180.
- The average case fatality rate (CFR) for the region stands at 1.5%. The highest CFRs in the region are reported in Liberia at 6.2% and the lowest in Guinea, Ghana, and Côte d'Ivoire at 0.6%.


